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establishment or massage school license for a period of up to 90 1 days after the date on which the application for the license is 2 submitted if the commission or executive director has reasonable 3 cause to believe an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code: 4 5 (1) is being or is likely to be committed at the location for which the license is sought; or 6 7 (2) was committed at a massage establishment or massage school owned or operated by the applicant or, if the 8 applicant is an entity, operated by any owner or operator of the 9 10 applicant. (f) For purposes of Subsection (e), the date that an 11 application is submitted is the date on which a complete 12 13 application is received by the department, including any additional 14 requested materials. 15 SECTION 3.
