- 4 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 5 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt
- 6 rules required by Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by
- 7 this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. A peace officer is not required to comply with
- 9 rules adopted under Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by
- 10 this Act, until January 1, 2027.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
