4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1701.318 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1701.318. CERTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR PEACE OFFICERS TO
8	CONDUCT POLYGRAPH EXAMINATIONS. (a) The commission by rule may
9	establish minimum requirements for the training, testing, and
10	certification of peace officers to conduct polygraph examinations
11	for the purpose of:
12	(1) a preemployment examination of a candidate
13	applying for a position that requires a license under this chapter;
14	or
15	(2) a criminal investigation.
16	(b) The commission shall adopt rules prohibiting a peace
17	officer from conducting a polygraph examination for a purpose
18	described by Subsection (a) unless the officer:
19	(1) completes a training course approved by the
20	commission; and
21	(2) passes an examination administered by the
22	commission that is designed to test the officer's knowledge of
23	investigative polygraphy.
24	(c) The commission shall issue a certification to conduct

1	polygraph examinations to a peace officer who applies for the
2	certification, completes the required training, and passes the
3	required examination.
4	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
5	of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt
6	rules required by Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by
7	this Act.
8	SECTION 3. A peace officer is not required to comply with
9	rules adopted under Section 1701.318, Occupations Code, as added by

10 this Act, until January 1, 2027.

11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
