A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the regulation of sanitarians and sanitarians in
- 3 training.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1953.001, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subdivision (3) and adding Subdivision (3-a) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (3) "Sanitarian" means an individual [a person]
- 9 trained in sanitary science to perform duties relating to education
- 10 and inspections in environmental sanitation.
- 11 (3-a) "Sanitarian in training" means an individual
- 12 training in sanitary science while engaged in sanitation.
- SECTION 2. Section 1953.003, Occupations Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1953.003. EXEMPTIONS. This chapter does not apply to
- 16 an individual [a person], including a physician, dentist, engineer,
- 17 or veterinarian, who is licensed by an agency of this state other
- 18 than the department and who, by nature of the <u>individual's</u>
- 19 [person's] employment or duties, might be construed as being
- 20 subject to this chapter.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 1953.101, Occupations Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1953.101. REGISTRATION REQUIRED. An individual [A
- 24 person] who engages or offers to engage in work in sanitation may

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- 1 not represent that the <u>individual</u> [person] is a sanitarian or use a
- 2 title containing the word "sanitarian" unless the individual
- 3 [person] holds a certificate of registration under this chapter.
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 1953.102, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1953.102. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. (a) To be
- 7 eligible to receive a certificate of registration as a
- 8 [professional] sanitarian, an individual [a person] must:
- 9 (1) hold at least a bachelor's degree from an
- 10 accredited college or university that includes at least 30 semester
- 11 hours in basic or applied science;
- 12 (2) complete any additional training in the basic
- 13 sciences or public health the department determines necessary to
- 14 effectively serve as a [professional] sanitarian; and
- 15 (3) have at least two years of full-time experience in
- 16 sanitation.
- 17 (b) The commission by rule may establish additional [other]
- 18 qualifications for registration.
- 19 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 1953.104, Occupations
- 20 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 1953.104. ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE: [PROFESSIONAL]
- 22 SANITARIAN; TERM.
- SECTION 6. Section 1953.104(a), Occupations Code, is
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (a) The department shall issue a certificate of
- 26 registration as a [professional] sanitarian to an individual [a
- 27 person] who:

- 1 (1) applies in the manner and on the form prescribed by
- 2 the executive director;
- 3 (2) pays the registration fee set by the commission by
- 4 rule;
- 5 (3) meets the eligibility requirements prescribed by
- 6 Section 1953.102 and commission rule; and
- 7 (4) passes the [an] examination required by Section
- 8 1953.151 [under Subchapter D].
- 9 SECTION 7. Section 1953.105(a), Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) The department shall issue a certificate of
- 12 registration as a sanitarian in training to an individual [a
- 13 person] who:
- 14 (1) is employed in sanitation;
- 15 (2) meets the eligibility requirements prescribed by
- 16 Section 1953.102, other than the requirements relating to
- 17 experience;
- 18 (3) has less than one year of full-time experience in
- 19 sanitation;
- 20 <u>(4)</u> pays a registration fee prescribed by the
- 21 commission by rule for a sanitarian in training; and
- (5) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ passes an examination under Subchapter D.
- 23 SECTION 8. Section 1953.106, Occupations Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1953.106. RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE. The department
- 26 shall [Te] renew a certificate of registration under this chapter
- 27 <u>if the certificate holder</u> [, a professional sanitarian must]:

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- 1 (1) pays [pay] to the department a renewal fee
- 2 prescribed by the commission by rule; and
- 3 (2) <u>provides</u> [provide] proof of completion of any
- 4 applicable continuing education requirements prescribed by the
- 5 commission by rule.
- 6 SECTION 9. Section 1953.201(a), Occupations Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The commission or executive director may deny <u>an</u>
- 9 individual's [a person's] application for a certificate of
- 10 registration if:
- 11 (1) the <u>individual's</u> [<u>person's</u>] certificate or license
- 12 to engage in a profession in this state or elsewhere has been
- 13 revoked for unprofessional conduct, fraud, deceit, negligence, or
- 14 misconduct in the practice of the profession; or
- 15 (2) satisfactory proof is presented to the commission
- 16 or executive director establishing that the individual [person] has
- 17 been found guilty of unprofessional conduct, fraud, deceit,
- 18 negligence, or misconduct in the practice of a profession.
- 19 SECTION 10. Sections 1953.151(b) and (c), Occupations Code,
- 20 are repealed.
- 21 SECTION 11. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
