4	SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding
5	Chapter 61 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 61. OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING RECIPROCITY AGREEMENTS
7	Sec. 61.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Licensing authority" means a department,
9	commission, board, office, or other agency of this state that
10	issues or renews an occupational license.
11	(2) "Occupational license" means a license, permit,
12	registration, certificate, or other form of authorization that must
13	be obtained by an individual to engage in a business, occupation, or
14	profession.
15	Sec. 61.002. GOAL FOR OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING RECIPROCITY
16	AGREEMENTS. Each licensing authority shall:
17	(1) maximize occupational licensing reciprocity
18	agreements to the extent allowed by law; and
19	(2) identify state laws that prevent the licensing
20	authority from entering into a reciprocity agreement with a
21	licensing authority in another state.
22	Sec. 61.003. RULES. A licensing authority shall adopt
23	rules necessary to implement this chapter. The rules must
24	establish procedures for the licensing authority to:

No. 2531 (1) determine whether the licensing requirements of 1 2 another state are substantially equivalent to the requirements of 3 this state, taking into consideration: 4 (A) the level of required training and testing to obtain a license, including methods used to evaluate work 5 experience to fulfill training or testing requirements; 6 7 (B) the scope of practice for which the license 8 is issued; and 9 (C) the procedures used in the other state to 10 resolve complaints and to determine whether a license holder is in good standing; and 11 12 (2) enter into and implement reciprocity agreements with licensing authorities in other states that have occupational 13 licensing requirements substantially equivalent to this state's 14 15 requirements. Sec. 61.004. REPORT. Not later than December 1 of each 16 17 odd-numbered year, each licensing authority shall submit to the governor and the Legislative Budget Board a written report that: 18 19 (1) summarizes the licensing authority's efforts under Section 61.002, including a description of the extent to which this 20 state's licensing requirements exceed the requirements of other 21 22 states; (2) describes the licensing authority's efforts to 23 24 enter into reciprocity agreements with licensing authorities in other states, including a list of: 25 26 (A) each reciprocity agreement entered into; and 27 (B) any unsuccessful effort to enter into a

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1 reciprocity agreement with a licensing authority of another state;
2 and

3 <u>(3) recommends any legislative action that is</u> 4 <u>necessary or appropriate to increase the number of occupational</u> 5 <u>license reciprocity agreements as directed by this chapter,</u> 6 <u>including any reduction of this state's licensing requirements that</u> 7 would make more reciprocity agreements possible.

8 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2026, each licensing 9 authority shall adopt the rules required by Section 61.003, 10 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Section 61.004, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, a licensing authority shall submit the initial report required by that section not later than December 1, 2027.

15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
