S.B. No. 2587

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the access to and use of certain criminal history record information, to the procedure for obtaining that information, and to the correct terminology for certain licenses the issuance of which requires a criminal history background check.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 411.0845(e), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(e) A person entitled to receive criminal history record information under this section must provide the department with the following information regarding the person who is the subject of the criminal history record information requested:

(1) the person's full name, date of birth, and sex, ~~[and social security number,~~ and the number assigned to any form of unexpired identification card issued by this state or another state, the District of Columbia, or a territory of the United States that includes the person's photograph;

(2) a recent electronic digital image photograph of the person and a complete set of the person's fingerprints as required by the department; and

(3) any other information required by the department.

SECTION 2. Section 411.086(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) Rules adopted by the department:

1 (1) shall provide for a uniform method of requesting
2 criminal history record information from the department;

3 (2) may require a person requesting criminal history
4 record information about an individual to submit to the department
5 one or more of the following:

6 (A) the complete name, race, and sex of the
7 individual;

8 (B) any known alias name of the individual;

9 (C) a complete set of the individual's
10 fingerprints;

11 (D) a recent photograph of the individual;

12 (E) any known identifying number of the
13 individual, including [~~social security number,~~] FBI number,
14 driver's license number, or state identification number;

15 (F) the individual's date of birth;

16 (G) any known alias dates of birth of the
17 individual; or

18 (H) any other information the department
19 determines is necessary to identify the individual or the record;

20 (3) shall provide for the methods and formats for
21 dissemination of criminal history record information; and

22 (4) shall provide security measures and policies that
23 are designed to guard against unauthorized release or dissemination
24 of criminal history record information that is maintained or
25 disseminated by the department.

26 SECTION 3. Section [411.087](#)(e), Government Code, is amended
27 to read as follows:

1 (e) The department may provide access to state and national
2 criminal history record information to a qualified entity
3 ~~[entities]~~ entitled to that information regarding the entity's
4 employees and contractors under the National Child Protection Act
5 of 1993 (34 U.S.C. Section 40102) ~~[42 U.S.C. Section 5119a]~~. The
6 department must follow federal law and regulation, federal
7 executive orders, and federal policy in releasing information under
8 this subsection.

9 SECTION 4. Section [411.095](#)(b), Government Code, is amended
10 to read as follows:

11 (b) The consumer credit commissioner may not release or
12 disclose to any person criminal history record information obtained
13 from the Federal Bureau of Investigation under Subsection (a-1)(1),
14 except to the person who is the subject of the criminal history
15 record information. The consumer credit commissioner may not
16 release or disclose criminal history record information obtained
17 under Subsection (a-1)(2) except:

- 18 (1) on court order;
- 19 (2) to the person who is the subject of the criminal
20 history record information;
- 21 (3) with the consent of the person who is the subject
22 of the criminal history record information; or
- 23 (4) in a hearing where the Office of Consumer Credit
24 Commissioner is a party.

25 SECTION 5. Section [411.106](#)(a), Government Code, is amended

11 license under Chapter 981, Insurance Code, or associated with an
12 entity that is an applicant for or holder of such a license;

13 (C) an applicant for or holder of a life
14 insurance provider or broker license under Chapter 1111A, Insurance
15 Code, or associated with an entity that is an applicant for or
16 holder of such a license;

17 (D) an applicant for or holder of a title
18 insurance agent license under Chapter 2651, Insurance Code, or
19 associated with an entity that is an applicant for or holder of such
20 a license;

21 (E) an applicant for or holder of an escrow
22 officer license under Chapter 2652, Insurance Code, or associated
23 with an entity that is an applicant for or holder of such a license;

24 (F) an applicant for or holder of an agent
25 license, temporary license, or provisional permit under Chapter
26 4001, Insurance Code;

27 (G) an applicant for or holder of a general

1 property and casualty license under Chapter 4051, Insurance Code,
2 or associated with an entity that is an applicant for or holder of
3 such a license;

4 (H) an applicant for or holder of a managing
5 general agent license under Chapter 4053, Insurance Code, or
6 associated with an entity that is an applicant for or holder of such

8 (I) an applicant for or holder of a license under
9 Chapter 4054, Insurance Code, or associated with an entity that is

1 (O) an applicant for or holder of a risk manager
2 license under Chapter 4153, Insurance Code, or associated with an
3 entity that is an applicant for or holder of such a license;

4 (P) an applicant for or holder of a certificate
5 of registration under Chapter 4201, Insurance Code, or associated
6 with an entity that is an applicant for or holder of such a
7 certificate;

8 (Q) associated with an independent review
9 organization that is an applicant for or holder of a certification
10 under Chapter 4202, Insurance Code;

11 (R) associated with a discount health care
12 program operator that is an applicant for or holder of a
13 registration under Chapter 7001, Insurance Code; and

14 (S) an applicant for or holder of a license under
15 Chapter 91, Labor Code; or

16 (2) a corporate officer or director of an insurance
17 company regulated by the Texas Department of Insurance, including a
18 company that is an applicant for or holder of a certificate of
19 authority under the following provisions of the Insurance Code:

17 (a-1) Criminal history record information the Health and

23 or a combination of direct and indirect ownership interests, that

16 (e) In this section:

17 (1) "Managing employee", with respect to a provider or
18 person applying to enroll as a provider, means an individual,
19 including a general manager, business manager, administrator, or
20 director, who:

21 (A) exercises operational or managerial control
22 over all or part of the provider or applicant; or

23 (B) directly or indirectly conducts the daily
24 operations of all or part of the provider or applicant.

25 (2) "Ownership interest", with respect to a provider
26 or person applying to enroll as a provider, means having equity in
27 the provider's or applicant's capital, stock, or profits.

1 (3) "Provider" means an individual or entity that
2 engages in the delivery of health care services and is authorized to
3 deliver those services in this state, including an individual or
4 entity that delivers health care services to recipients under the
5 medical assistance program.

(B) a backflow prevention assembly tester license required by Section 341.034(c), Health and Safety Code [Chapter 1903, Occupations Code]; [or]

(C) a customer service inspector license

1 required by Section 341.034(d), Health and Safety Code [~~Chapters 26~~
2 ~~and 37, Water Code~~];

3 (D) a municipal solid waste facility supervisor
4 license required by Section 361.027, Health and Safety Code;

5 (E) an on-site sewage facility installer license
6 or apprentice registration required by Section 366.071(a), Health
7 and Safety Code;

8 (F) an on-site sewage facility maintenance
9 provider license or maintenance technician registration required

(a) The manufactured housing division of the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is:

(1) an applicant for or holder of:

(A) a manufacturer's license required by Section 1201.101(a), Occupations Code;

(B) a retailer's license required by Section 1201.101(b) or (e), Occupations Code;

(C) a broker's license required by Section 1201.101(c), Occupations Code;

(D) an installer's license required by Section 1201.101(d), Occupations Code; or

(E) a salesperson's license required by Section 1201.101(f) [a license under Chapter 1201], Occupations Code; or

(2) an owner, officer, or related person or manager of a person described by Subdivision (1).

SECTION 12. Section 411.12509(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The state fire marshal is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is an applicant for or holder of:

(1) a fire extinguisher license or apprentice permit under Chapter 6001, Insurance Code;

(2) a fire alarm technician or residential fire alarm technician license, a residential fire alarm superintendent license, or a fire alarm planning superintendent license required by Section 6002.154, Insurance Code;

(3) a fire alarm training school or instructor approval required under Section 6002.158, Insurance Code;

(4) a fire protection sprinkler system contractor registration certificate or a responsible managing employee license required by Chapter 6003, Insurance Code; or

(5) a license required by Subchapters C and D, Chapter 2154, Occupations Code ~~[a license issued by the state fire marshal]~~.

SECTION 13. Sections 411.12510(a) and (d), Government Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The Texas Medical Board is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is:

(1) an applicant for or holder of a license to practice

1 medicine;

2 (2) an applicant for or holder of a license to practice
3 as a physician assistant;

4 (3) an applicant for or holder of a license to practice
5 as an acupuncturist;

6 (4) an applicant for or holder of a certificate to
7 practice as an acudetox specialist;

8 (5) an applicant for or holder of a license to practice
9 as a surgical assistant;

10 (6) an applicant for or holder of a general
11 certificate to perform radiologic procedures, limited certificate
12 to perform radiologic procedures only on specific parts of the
13 body, or radiologist assistant certificate;

14 (7) an applicant for or holder of a placement on the
15 registry of noncertified technicians;

16 (8) an employee of an applicant for a hardship
17 exemption;

18 (9) an applicant for or holder of a license to practice
19 as a medical physicist;

20 (10) an applicant for or holder of a license to
21 practice as a perfusionist;

22 (11) an applicant for or holder of a license to
23 practice as a respiratory care practitioner; ~~and~~

24 (12) an applicant for or holder of a pain management

(d) The Texas Medical Board is not prohibited from disclosing criminal history record information obtained under Subsection (b)(2) in a hearing conducted by the Texas Medical Board or its advisory boards or by the State Office of Administrative Hearings.

SECTION 14. Section 411.12511(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person:

(1) who is an applicant for or holds a general distinguishing number under Chapter 503, Transportation Code;

(2) who is an applicant for or holds a license under Chapter 2301 or 2302, Occupations Code; ~~or~~

(3) who is an owner, officer, director, member, manager, principal, partner, trustee, or trust beneficiary of an applicant, general distinguishing number holder, or license holder; or

(4) who is an employee designated as an authorized representative by ~~[other person acting in a representative capacity for]~~ an applicant, general distinguishing number holder, or license holder and whose act or omission in the course or scope of the person's representation would be cause for denying, revoking, or suspending a general distinguishing number or license issued under Chapter 503, Transportation Code, or Chapter 2301 or 2302, Occupations Code.

SECTION 15. Section 411.12517, Government Code, is amended

by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsections (a-1), (a-2), (g), and (h) to read as follows:

(a) The Texas State Board of Pharmacy is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who:

(1) is an applicant for or holder of a ~~[license, certificate,]~~ registration as a pharmacist-intern under Section 557.001~~[, permit, or other authorization under Chapters 557, 558, 559, and 568]~~, Occupations Code;

(2) is an applicant for or holder of a ~~[Class A, Class B, Class C, Class D, or Class E pharmacy]~~ license by examination to practice pharmacy under Section 558.051 ~~[Chapters 560 and 561]~~, Occupations Code;

(3) is an applicant for or holder of a license by reciprocity to practice pharmacy under Section 558.101, Occupations Code;

(4) is an applicant for or holder of a provisional license to practice pharmacy under Subchapter D, Chapter 558, Occupations Code;

(5) is an applicant for or holder of a registration as a pharmacy technician or a pharmacy technician trainee under Section 568.002, Occupations Code;

(6) ~~[(3)]~~ requests a determination of eligibility for a license, certificate, registration, permit, or other authorization from the Texas State Board of Pharmacy under Subchapter D, Chapter 53, Occupations Code; or

(7) ~~[(4)]~~ is an applicant for employment at or current

employee of the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.

(a-1) The Texas State Board of Pharmacy is entitled to obtain a complete set of fingerprints from a person described by Subsection (a).

(a-2) The Texas State Board of Pharmacy is entitled to obtain criminal history record information as provided by Subsection (b) that relates to a person who is:

(1) a partner, officer, director, managing employee, or owner or person who controls the owner of a pharmacy; and

(2) an applicant for or a holder of a Class A, B, C, D, or E pharmacy license issued under Section 560.051, Occupations Code.

(b) Subject to Section 411.087 and consistent with the public policy of this state, the Texas State Board of Pharmacy is entitled to:

(1) obtain through the Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal history record information maintained or indexed by that bureau that pertains to a person described by Subsection (a) or (a-2); and

(2) obtain from the department or any other criminal justice agency in this state criminal history record information maintained by the department or that criminal justice agency that relates to a person described by Subsection (a) or (a-2).

(g) The failure or refusal of an employee of or an applicant for employment at the Texas State Board of Pharmacy to provide the following on request constitutes good cause for dismissal or refusal to hire:

- 1 (1) a complete set of fingerprints;
- 2 (2) a true and complete name; or
- 3 (3) other information necessary for a law enforcement
- 4 entity to obtain criminal history record information.

5 (h) An applicant for renewal of a license or registration
6 described by Subsection (a) who has not yet submitted a complete set
7 of fingerprints as part of a previous application for the license or
8 registration shall submit to the Texas State Board of Pharmacy a
9 complete set of fingerprints with the person's completed
10 application for renewal. Failure to submit a complete set of
11 fingerprints under this subsection may result in a suspension or
12 refusal to renew the applicable license or registration by the
13 Texas State Board of Pharmacy.

14 SECTION 16. Section 411.136(c), Government Code, is amended
15 to read as follows:

16 (c) The public or nonprofit hospital or hospital district
17 shall adopt a uniform method to obtain criminal history record
18 information from persons described by Subsection (b). The hospital
19 or district may require the complete name, driver's license number,
20 or fingerprints~~[, or social security number]~~ of those persons.

21 SECTION 17. Section 503.308, Occupations Code, is amended
22 to read as follows:

23 Sec. 503.308. ASSOCIATE ~~[TEMPORARY]~~ LICENSE. (a) The
24 executive council by rule may provide for the issuance of an
25 associate ~~[a temporary]~~ license. Rules adopted under this
26 subsection must provide a time limit for the period an associate ~~[a~~
27 ~~temporary]~~ license is valid.

1 (b) The executive council by rule may adopt a system under
2 which an associate [~~a temporary~~] license may be issued to a person
3 who:

4 (1) meets all of the academic and examination
5 requirements for licensing; and

6 (2) enters into a supervisory agreement with a
7 supervisor approved by the executive council.

8 SECTION 18. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
9 over another Act of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,
10 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
11 codes.

12 SECTION 19. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
