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          SECTION 1. Article 56C.001(2), Code of Criminal Procedure,
   is amended to read as follows:

          SECTION 2. Article 56C.003, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
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   amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (b-1),
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    (c-1), and (e) to read as follows:
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               From money appropriated for the purpose, the attorney
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   general shall establish and administer a program to compensate
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   landowners and lessees who suffer real property damage on
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   agricultural land caused by:
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               (1) a trespasser as a result of an offense under
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   Chapter 28, Penal Code, that was committed in the course of or in
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   furtherance of a border crime; or
               (2) a law enforcement response to a trespasser who was
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- 1 engaged in a border crime.
- 2 (b-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), damage caused to
- 3 agricultural land includes any debris, pollutants, or contaminants
- 4 left on the land during the applicable incident, and compensation
- 5 awarded under this article may include an amount necessary to clean
- 6 debris, pollutants, or contaminants.
- 7 (c-1) The attorney general may not award compensation under
- 8 this article to a lessee for real property damage caused by a
- 9 trespasser described by Subsection (a)(1) unless the lessee
- 10 provides a notarized statement from the landowner authorizing the
- 11 lessee to directly receive compensation awarded under this article
- 12 for the damage.
- (e) On request by the attorney general and not later than
- 14 the 14th business day after the date of the request, a law
- 15 enforcement agency shall release to the attorney general all
- 16 reports, including witness statements and criminal history record
- 17 <u>information</u>, to allow the attorney general to determine whether a
- 18 person qualifies for an award of compensation under this article

- SECTION 3. Section 2251.052, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 21 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 22 <u>(a-1) In setting rates, an insurer may not consider whether</u>
- 23 a claim has been made by or on behalf of a policyholder in relation
- 24 to an event documented by a report described by Article 56C.003(c),

- SECTION 4. Section 2251.052(a-1), Insurance Code, as added
- 27 by this Act, applies only to an insurance policy that is delivered,

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- 1 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2026. A
- 2 policy delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1,
- 3 2026, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the
- 4 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for
- 5 that purpose.
- 6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
