A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to the operation and management of the Panhandle-Plains 2 3 Historical Museum by the Texas Historical Commission. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Chapter 442, Government Code, is amended by adding 5 6 Subchapter B-3 to read as follows: 7 SUBCHAPTER B-3. PANHANDLE-PLAINS HISTORICAL MUSEUM Sec. 442.067. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "museum" 8 means the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum in Canyon, Texas. 9 10 Sec. 442.068. PANHANDLE-PLAINS HISTORICAL MUSEUM; FUND. (a) The museum currently consists of a facility on the campus of 11 West Texas A&M University and a collection owned by the 12 Panhandle-Plains Historical Society. 13 (b) To the extent authorized by law, the commission may 14 15 enter into a contract with the Panhandle-Plains Historical Society for the operation and management of the museum. The commission may 16 17 also enter into a contract with West Texas A&M University or The Texas A&M University System, as needed for the construction, 18 renovation, expansion, maintenance, or management of museum 19 facilities on the campus of West Texas A&M University. 20 (c) The contract with the Panhandle-Plains Historical 21 22 Society authorized by this section must include provisions for: 23 (1) expanding, renovating, managing, 24 maintaining, operating, or providing financial support for the

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1	museum collection and museum facility and related assets;
2	(2) preserving the museum's collection;
3	(3) employing a museum director and other
4	employees the commission considers necessary to fulfill its duties
5	and responsibilities under the contract;
6	(4) accepting donations of money, property, and
7	historical relics; and
8	(5) acquiring property and historical relics
9	with funds available for that purpose.
10	(d) The Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum fund is created
11	as a fund outside the state treasury. The commission shall
12	administer the fund but may contract with the Panhandle-Plains
13	Historical Society for administration of the fund. The fund
14	consists of:
15	(1) admissions revenue from the operation of the
16	museum;
17	(2) sales revenue from the operation of the
18	museum gift shop; and
19	(3) donations made to the commission for the
20	museum.
21	(e) Money in the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum
22	fund may be spent without legislative appropriation and only to
23	administer, operate, preserve, repair, expand, or otherwise
24	maintain the museum.
25	(f) Interest and income from the assets of the
26	Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum fund shall be credited to and
27	deposited in the fund.

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SECTION 2. Section 61.003(6), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

(6) "Other agency of higher education" means The University 3 4 of Texas System, System Administration; The University of Texas at El Paso Museum; Texas Epidemic Public Health Institute at The 5 University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston; The Texas A&M 6 7 University System, Administrative and General Offices; Texas A&M AgriLife Research; Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service; Rodent and 8 9 Predatory Animal Control Service (a part of the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service); Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station 10 11 (including the Texas A&M Transportation Institute); Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service; Texas A&M Forest Service; Texas 12 13 Division of Emergency Management; Texas Tech University Museum; Texas State University System, System Administration; Sam Houston 14 15 Memorial Museum; [<u>Panhandle=Plains Historical Museum;</u>] Cotton 16 Research Committee of Texas; Texas Water Resources Institute; Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory; and any other unit, 17 division, institution, or agency which shall be so designated by 18 statute or which may be established to operate as a component part 19 20 of any public senior college or university, or which may be so classified as provided in this chapter. 21

22 SECTION 3. On September 1, 2025, an employee of West Texas A&M University assigned exclusively to the museum becomes 23 an 24 employee of the commission.

25 SECTION 4. Section 102.35, Education Code, is repealed. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 SECTION 5. 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
