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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the exemption from the assessment requirements of the
3	Texas Success Initiative for certain students who are public
4	officers or employees.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 51.332, Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	Sec. 51.332. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter does not apply
9	to:
10	(1) a student who has graduated with an associate or
11	baccalaureate degree from an institution of higher education;
12	(2) a student who transfers to an institution of
13	higher education from a private or independent institution of
14	higher education or an accredited out-of-state institution of
15	higher education and who has satisfactorily completed
16	<pre>college-level coursework;</pre>
17	(3) a student who is enrolled in a certificate program
18	of one year or less at a public junior college, a public technical
19	institute, or a public state college;
20	(4) a student who is serving on active duty as a member
21	of:
22	(A) the armed forces of the United States; or
23	(B) the Texas National Guard;
24	(5) a student who is currently serving as and, for at

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least the three-year period preceding enrollment, has served as a 1 2 member of a reserve component of the armed forces of the United States; [<del>or</del>] 3 4 (6) a student who on or after August 1, 1990, was honorably discharged, retired, or released from: 5 6 (A) active duty as a member of the armed forces of 7 the United States or the Texas National Guard; or

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8 (B) service as a member of a reserve component of
9 the armed forces of the United States;

10 (7) a student who is:

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11 (A) certified as an emergency medical technician 12 under Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code; and

(B) employed by a political subdivision;

14 <u>(8) a student who is included as fire protection</u> 15 personnel by Section 419.021, Government Code; or

16 (9) a student who is elected, appointed, or employed 17 to serve as a peace officer described by Article 2A.001, Code of 18 Criminal Procedure, or other law.

19 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies 20 beginning with the assessment of entering undergraduate students at 21 public institutions of higher education for the 2025 fall semester. 22 The assessment of an entering undergraduate student for an academic 23 term before that semester is covered by the law in effect before the 24 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 25 that purpose.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
