Subchapter C, Chapter 154, Government Code, is 25 amended by adding Section 154.1035 to read as follows: 26 Sec. 154.1035. DIGITAL REPORTING DOCUMENTATION. 27 Before

1	issuing a certification for digital reporting under Section
2	154.101, the commission shall require an applicant to provide
3	documentation:
4	(1) demonstrating the applicant is proficient in the
5	use of the digital technology used for digital reporting; and
6	(2) certifying the use of the digital technology for
7	digital reporting poses minimal risk of inaccuracy, algorithmic
8	discrimination, bias, or unlawful dissemination of privileged or
9	personal identifying information.
