A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to courses to understand the United States and Texas
3	Constitutions for high school students in public schools.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to
6	read as follows:
7	(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through
8	grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:
9	(1) a foundation curriculum that includes:
10	(A) English language arts;
11	(B) mathematics;
12	(C) science; and
13	(D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United
14	States, and world history, government, <u>United States Constitution</u>
15	and Texas Constitution, economics, with emphasis on the free
16	enterprise system and its benefits, and geography; and
17	(2) an enrichment curriculum that includes:
18	(A) to the extent possible, languages other than
19	English;
20	(B) health, with emphasis on:
21	(i) physical health, including the
22	importance of proper nutrition and exercise;
23	(ii) mental health, including instruction
24	about mental health conditions, substance abuse, skills to manage

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- 1 emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and
- 2 responsible decision-making; and
- 3 (iii) suicide prevention, including
- 4 recognizing suicide-related risk factors and warning signs;
- 5 (C) physical education;
- 6 (D) fine arts;
- 7 (E) career and technology education;
- 8 (F) technology applications; and
- 9 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
- 10 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
- 11 history and literature, and,
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 28.0021(b), Education Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (b) Each school district and each open-enrollment charter
- 15 school that offers a high school program shall provide \underline{a} [an
- 16 <u>elective</u>] course in <u>The United States Constitution and the Texas</u>
- 17 <u>Constitution</u> that meets the requirements for a one-half <u>social</u>
- 18 studies [elective] credit under Section 28.025, using materials
- 19 approved by the State Board of Education. In fulfilling the
- 20 requirement to provide financial literacy instruction under this
- 21 section, a school district or open-enrollment charter school may
- 22 use an existing state, federal, private, or nonprofit program that
- 23 provides students without charge the instruction described under
- 24 this section.
- SECTION 3. Sections 28.025(b-1) and (b-23), Education Code,
- 26 are amended to read as follows:
- 27 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require

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- 1 that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school
- 2 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students
- 3 successfully complete:
- 4 (1) four credits in English language arts under
- 5 Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one
- 6 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in
- 7 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 8 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section
- 9 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in
- 10 geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course
- 11 authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 12 (3) three credits in science under Section
- 13 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any
- 14 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one
- 15 credit in integrated physics and chemistry or in an additional
- 16 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 17 (4) three credits in social studies under Section
- 18 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at
- 19 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in
- 20 [economics or] The United States Constitution and the Texas
- 21 Constitution [& economics], and one credit in economics, world
- 22 geography, or world history;
- 23 (5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12),
- 24 (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language
- other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);
- 26 (6) five elective credits;
- 27 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section

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1 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
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- 2 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
- 3 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- 4 (b-23) The agency shall:
- 5 (1) develop a list of free, open-source, and publicly
- 6 available curricula that may be used by a school district to provide
- 7 a United States Constitution and Texas Constitution [& economics]
- 8 course that satisfies the curriculum requirement under Subsection
- 9 (b-1)(4); and
- 10 (2) seek, accept, and spend any federal or private
- 11 grant funds and gifts that are available for the purpose of
- 12 providing a United States Constitution and Texas Constitution [&
- 13 economics] course as part of the foundation high school program.
- SECTION 4. Section 28.025(b-22), Education Code, is
- 15 repealed.
- 16 SECTION 5. Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1), Education
- 17 Code, as amended by this Act, apply only to students entering the
- 18 ninth grade during the 2025-2026 school year or a later school year.
- 19 For students entering a grade above ninth grade during the
- 20 2025-2026 school year, Sections 28.0021(b) and 28.025(b-1),
- 21 Education Code, as those sections existed before amendment by this
- 22 Act, apply, and those sections are continued in effect for that
- 23 purpose.
- SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 25 school year.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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- 1 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 2 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 3 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
