A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to innovations in core curriculum to accelerate the award
3	of bachelor's degrees, including the establishment of the general
4	education curriculum advisory committee.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 61.0522 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 61.0522. GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM ADVISORY
9	COMMITTEE. (a) In this section:
10	(1) "Advisory committee" means the general education
11	curriculum advisory committee established under this section.
12	(2) "General education curriculum" means a core
13	curriculum, as that term is defined by Section 61.821, and any other
14	curriculum or competency all undergraduate students of an
15	institution of higher education are required to complete before
16	receiving an undergraduate degree.
17	(b) The board shall establish an advisory committee to
18	review the general education curriculum requirements of
19	institutions of higher education.
20	(c) The board shall call for nominations from presidents or
21	chief executive officers, chancellors, and chief academic officers
22	at all institutions of higher education for representatives to
23	serve on the advisory committee. The board shall select a number of
24	representatives determined by the board from those nominated with

1	nominees drawn equally from two-year and four-year institutions.
2	(d) The advisory committee shall consider methods for
3	determining general education curriculum component courses and for
4	condensing the number of general education curriculum courses
5	required at institutions of higher education.
6	(e) Not later than November 1, 2026, the advisory committee
7	shall produce a report regarding the advisory committee's findings
8	and recommendations under this section and provide the report to
9	the board.
10	(f) Not later than December 31, 2026, the board shall review
11	the advisory committee's report and submit to the legislature the
12	board's recommendations for legislative or other action necessary
13	to implement the findings of the report.
14	(g) The advisory committee is abolished and this section
15	expires September 1, 2027.
16	SECTION 2. Section 61.822, Education Code, is amended by
17	adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
18	(b-1) The board by rule may approve a core curriculum of
19	fewer than 42 semester credit hours for a bachelor's degree program
20	at an institution of higher education if the board determines that
21	the approval would accelerate student completion of
22	workforce-aligned credentials, as defined by board rule.
23	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
