A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to the task force on pollinator health.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B , Chapter 11 , Parks and Wildlife
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 11.0301 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 11.0301. TASK FORCE ON POLLINATOR HEALTH. (a) In this
7	section, "task force" means the task force on pollinator health
8	under this section. The director shall establish the task force and
9	the membership of the task force.
10	(b) The task force consists of members appointed by the
11	director, including:
12	(1) one member who is a university faculty member
13	specializing in the science of pollinator health;
14	(2) one member representing an advocacy group for
15	nurseries and greenhouse producers;
16	(3) one member representing an advocacy group for
17	agriculture in this state;
18	(4) one member representing an advocacy group
19	dedicated to the protection of pollinators and invertebrates;
20	(5) one member representing an advocacy group for
21	<pre>pesticide applicators;</pre>

the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and who represents the

(6) one member who is certified as a master gardener by

- 1 (7) one member who is a beekeeper and who represents
- 2 the public; and
- 3 (8) one member who is an employee of the department who
- 4 specializes in melittology.
- 5 (c) The task force shall undertake activities to examine
- 6 issues relevant to pollinator health, including:
- 7 (1) identifying ways the state can incentivize the
- 8 development of new pollinator habitat in residential, commercial,
- 9 and public areas;
- 10 (2) studying public education and outreach plans
- 11 regarding pollinator health that have been successful in other
- 12 states;
- 13 (3) investigating the means used by other states to
- 14 gather data on populations of bees or other pollinating insects;
- 15 and
- 16 (4) identifying ways to prevent loss of pollinator
- 17 habitat.
- 18 (d) The task force may take actions necessary and proper to
- 19 carry out the work of the task force, including scheduling hearings
- 20 and taking testimony on matters related to pollinator health.
- 21 (e) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes
- 22 a quorum for the transaction of business.
- 23 <u>(f) Official action by the task force requires the approval</u>
- 24 of a majority of the members of the task force.
- 25 (g) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as
- 26 presiding officer.
- 27 (h) The director shall appoint a qualified person to fill a

- 1 vacancy on the task force.
- 2 (i) The task force shall meet at times and places specified
- 3 by the call of the presiding officer or of a majority of the members
- 4 of the task force.
- 5 (j) The task force may adopt bylaws necessary for the
- 6 operation of the task force.
- 7 (k) Not later than October 1, 2026, the task force shall
- 8 submit a report, which may include recommendations for legislation,
- 9 to the standing committees of the senate and the house of
- 10 representatives with primary jurisdiction over wildlife. The task
- 11 force may provide progress reports to those committees before
- 12 <u>October 1, 2026.</u>
- 13 (1) The department may provide staff support to the task
- 14 force.
- 15 (m) Members of the task force are not entitled to
- 16 compensation but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel
- 17 and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official
- 18 duties in the manner and amounts provided for in the General
- 19 Appropriations Act.
- 20 (n) Each state agency shall assist the task force in the
- 21 performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws
- 22 relating to confidentiality, shall furnish information and advice
- 23 that the members of the task force consider necessary to perform
- 24 their duties.
- 25 (o) A member of the task force may participate remotely in a
- 26 meeting of the task force by means of a video conference call or
- 27 online service.

- 1 (p) This section expires December 31, 2026.
- 2 SECTION 2. Not later than October 1, 2025, the executive
- 3 director of the Parks and Wildlife Department shall appoint the
- 4 members of the task force on pollinator health under Section
- 5 11.0301(b), Parks and Wildlife Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
