## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the Task Force on Modernizing
3	Manufacturing.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 481, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter HH to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER HH. TASK FORCE ON MODERNIZING MANUFACTURING
8	Sec. 481.701. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "task force"
9	means the Task Force on Modernizing Manufacturing.
10	Sec. 481.702. CREATION OF TASK FORCE; COMPOSITION. (a) The
11	Task Force on Modernizing Manufacturing is established to study the
12	modernization of manufacturing in this state.
13	(b) The task force is composed of 15 members, consisting of:
14	(1) the executive director of the office or the
15	executive director's designee; and
16	(2) the following members appointed by the governor,
17	on the recommendation of the executive director of the office or the
18	executive director's designee:
19	(A) two members representing small manufacturers
20	with an established presence in this state;
21	(B) two members representing mid-sized
22	manufacturers with an established presence in this state;
23	(C) two members representing large manufacturers
24	with an established presence in this state;

1	(D) two experts in automation and digital
2	technologies related to manufacturing;
3	(E) one member representing the Texas Workforce
4	<pre>Commission;</pre>
5	(F) two members representing organized labor in
6	the manufacturing industry;
7	(G) one member representing the Texas Education
8	Agency;
9	(H) one member representing the Texas Higher
10	Education Coordinating Board; and
11	(I) one additional member representing the
12	office.
13	(c) The executive director of the office or the executive
14	director's designee shall serve as the presiding officer of the
15	task force.
16	(d) The task force shall meet at the call of the presiding
17	officer.
18	Sec. 481.703. DUTIES OF TASK FORCE. (a) The task force
19	shall:
20	(1) study the current state of manufacturing in this
21	state, with a focus on the adoption of automation and digital
22	technologies;
23	(2) identify barriers to the adoption of automation
24	and digital technologies in manufacturing;
25	(3) develop recommendations for policies and programs

to support the modernization of manufacturing in this state,

including incentives for the adoption of automation and digital

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- 1 technologies; and
- 2 (4) evaluate the potential economic effect of
- 3 modernizing manufacturing, including job creation and retention,
- 4 <u>increased productivity</u>, and competitiveness.
- 5 (b) The task force may establish subcommittees as necessary
- 6 to carry out its duties under this subchapter.
- 7 Sec. 481.704. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. The office shall
- 8 provide the staff and facilities necessary to assist the task force
- 9 in performing the task force's duties under this subchapter.
- Sec. 481.705. REPORT. Not later than October 1, 2026, the
- 11 task force shall prepare and deliver to the governor, the
- 12 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 13 and each standing committee of the legislature with primary
- 14 jurisdiction over economic development matters a report on the task
- 15 force's findings and recommendations for legislative or other
- 16 <u>action.</u>
- Sec. 481.706. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and
- 18 this subchapter expires September 1, 2027.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
