(2) "Gift aid" means a grant, scholarship, exemption, 11 12 waiver, or other financial aid awarded to a student without a 13 requirement to repay the aid or earn the aid through work. 14 (b) The coordinating board shall develop a financial aid 15 displacement advisory for use by institutions of higher education under this section that contains: 16 (1) a statement bordered by a line one point in weight 17 in a font not less than 14 points in size in the following form: 18 19 "Financial aid displacement occurs when a student's financial aid is reduced due to receipt of a private scholarship or 20 other reasons identified in this advisory. This practice occurs in 21 22 Texas and should be taken into consideration while applying for

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financial aid. The institution to which you are applying is

providing in this application a list of recommendations describing

- 1 how to maximize your financial aid and ensure that you are prepared
- 2 when financial aid displacement occurs. You are encouraged to
- 3 reach out to the institution to which you are applying to receive
- 4 advice on how to avoid financial aid displacement."; and
- 5 (2) a list of the most common reasons, as identified by
- 6 the coordinating board, for which the amount of gift aid awarded may
- 7 be revised or reduced under this chapter.
- 8 <u>(c) Each institution of higher education shall include in</u>
- 9 the institution's admission application form or provide in the
- 10 institution's admission application form a link to the financial
- 11 aid displacement advisory developed under Subsection (b) and, in
- 12 plain language:
- 13 (1) how to apply for gift aid at the institution;
- 14 (2) the timeline for financial aid processes at the
- 15 institution, including application deadlines, suggested deadlines
- 16 to report gift aid, and other deadlines of which the institution
- 17 <u>determines a prospective student should be made aware;</u>
- 18 (3) a list of recommendations to aid a prospective
- 19 student in maximizing gift aid awards, as determined by the
- 20 institution;
- 21 (4) a list of recommendations for a prospective
- 22 student to ensure the student's gift aid will not be reduced; and
- 23 (5) contact information for an employee or office at
- 24 the institution from whom a prospective student may seek advice
- 25 regarding gift aid.
- 26 (d) The coordinating board shall adopt rules necessary to
- 27 implement this section.
