5	SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to

- 9 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew

- SECTION 2. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 16 that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school
- 17 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students
- 18 successfully complete:
- 19 (1) four credits in English language arts under
- 20 Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one
- 21 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in
- 22 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 23 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section
- 24 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in
- 25 geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course

- 27 (3) three credits in science under Section

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- 1 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any
- 2 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one

- 5 (4) three credits in social studies under Section
- 6 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at
- 7 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in
- 8 economics or personal financial literacy & economics, and one
- 9 credit in ethnic studies, world geography, or world history;
- 10 (5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12),
- 11 (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language
- 12 other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);
- 13 (6) five elective credits;
- 14 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section
- 15 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
- 16 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
- 17 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- SECTION 3. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as amended
- 19 by this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade
- 20 during the 2026-2027 school year or a later school year. For
- 21 students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2026-2027
- 22 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that section
- 23 existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is
- 24 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
