S. B. No. 3035

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the creation of the Montgomery County Water Control and
3 Improvement District No. 7; granting a limited power of eminent
4 domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to
5 impose assessments, fees, and taxes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Subtitle I, Title 6, Special District Local Laws
8 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 9094 to read as follows:

9 CHAPTER 9094. MONTGOMERY COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT

10 DISTRICT NO. 7

11 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

12 Sec. 9094.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

13 (1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

16 (3) "Director" means a board member.

19 Sec. 9094.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a water
20 control and improvement district created under Section 59, Article
21 XVI, Texas Constitution.

22 Sec. 9094.0103. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTOR ELECTION
23 REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to
24 confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent

1 directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

2 Sec. 9094.0104. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The
3 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section
4 9094.0103 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or
5 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has
6 consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the
7 district and to the inclusion of land in the district as required by
8 applicable law.

9 Sec. 9094.0105. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.

10 (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.

11 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

12 (1) a water control and improvement district as
13 provided by general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas
14 Constitution, including the collection, transportation,
15 processing, disposal, and control of domestic, industrial, or
16 communal waste and the gathering, conducting, diverting, and
17 control of local stormwater or other harmful excesses of water; and

18 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that
19 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation,
20 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
21 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

22 Sec. 9094.0106. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
23 district is initially composed of the territory described by
24 Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.

25 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
26 the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the
27 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process

1 does not affect the district's:

SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

9 Sec. 9094.0201. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is
10 governed by a board of five elected directors.

11 (b) Except as provided by Section 9094.0202, directors
12 serve staggered four-year terms.

13 Sec. 9094.0202. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after the
14 effective date of the Act enacting this chapter, the owner or owners
15 of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the
16 district may submit a petition to the commission requesting that
17 the commission appoint as temporary directors the five persons
18 named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as temporary
19 directors the five persons named in the petition.

20 (b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

25 (c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
26 Section 9094.0103 and the terms of the temporary directors have
27 expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or

1 reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that
2 expire on the earlier of:

3 (1) the date permanent directors are elected under
4 Section 9094.0103; or

5 (2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the
6 appointment or reappointment.

7 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a
8 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district
9 may submit a petition to the commission requesting that the
10 commission appoint as successor temporary directors the five
11 persons named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as
12 successor temporary directors the five persons named in the
13 petition.

14 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

15 Sec. 9094.0301. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district
16 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for
17 which the district is created.

18 Sec. 9094.0302. WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT
19 POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided
20 by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 51,
21 Water Code, applicable to water control and improvement districts
22 created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and
23 specifically including the powers and duties authorized under
24 Subchapter H, Chapter 51, Water Code.

25 Sec. 9094.0303. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section
26 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design,
27 acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate,

1 maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for
2 operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
3 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

4 Sec. 9094.0304. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A
5 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,
6 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each
7 municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial
8 jurisdiction the road project is located.

9 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits
10 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road
11 project must meet all applicable construction standards,
12 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which
13 the road project is located.

14 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the
15 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and
16 specifications of the road project.

17 Sec. 9094.0305. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT
18 ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all
19 applicable requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is
20 adopted under Section 42.042 or 42.0425, Local Government Code, and
21 consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land
22 in the district.

23 Sec. 9094.0306. LIMITATION ON USE OF EMINENT DOMAIN. The
24 district may not exercise the power of eminent domain outside the
25 district boundaries to acquire a site or easement for:

26 (1) a recreational facility, as defined by Section
27 49.462, Water Code; or

1 (2) a road project authorized by Section 9094.0303.

2 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

3 Sec. 9094.0401. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a)

4 The district may issue, without an election, bonds and other
5 obligations secured by:

6 (1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or

7 (2) contract payments described by Section 9094.0403.

8 (b) The district must hold an election in the manner
9 provided by Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, to obtain voter approval
10 before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds
11 payable from ad valorem taxes.

12 (c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem
13 taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a
14 vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an
15 election held for that purpose.

16 Sec. 9094.0402. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
17 authorized at an election held under Section 9094.0401, the
18 district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable
19 property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water
20 Code.

21 (b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
22 exceed the rate approved at the election.

23 Sec. 9094.0403. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with
24 Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than
25 an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from
26 the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of
27 the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters

1 voting at an election held for that purpose.

2 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
3 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
4 the board without further voter approval.

SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS

6 Sec. 9094.0501. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER
7 OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations
8 payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees,
9 revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any
10 combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district
11 purpose.

12 Sec. 9094.0502. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district
13 issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the
14 board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing
15 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all
16 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner
17 provided by Chapter 51, Water Code.

18 Sec. 9094.0503. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of
19 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations
20 issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad
21 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the
22 real property in the district.

23 Sec. 9094.0504. BONDS FOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES. (a)
24 The district may develop recreational facilities and issue bonds
25 for recreational facilities as provided by Chapter 49, Water Code,
26 regardless of whether the district's territory overlaps with the
27 territory of a political subdivision that is authorized to develop

1 recreational facilities and issue bonds for recreational
2 facilities under Chapter 49, Water Code.

3 (b) The authority of the district to develop recreational
4 facilities and issue bonds for recreational facilities under this
5 section does not limit the authority of another political
6 subdivision whose territory the territory of the district may
7 overlap, wholly or partly, to develop recreational facilities and
8 issue bonds for recreational facilities under Chapter 49, Water
9 Code.

10 SECTION 2. The Montgomery County Water Control and
11 Improvement District No. 7 initially includes all the territory
12 contained in the following area:

13 BEING 480.79 acres of land in the Samuel Lindley Survey,
14 Abstract Number 23, the William Hulon Survey, Abstract Number 262,
15 the John Tong Survey, Abstract Number 39, and the George Lonis
16 Survey, Abstract Number 313 in Montgomery County, Texas, being a
17 portion of the called 811.345 acre tract described under "Schedule
18 1", a portion of the called 71.884 acre tract described under
19 "Schedule 2", all of the 4.15 acre tract described under "Schedule
20 4" and all of the called 4.15 acre tract described under "Schedule
21 5" in the deed from William McComb Dunwoody to Esperanza Ranch LLC,
22 recorded under Document Number 2024075466 of the Official Public
23 Records of Montgomery County, Texas, said 480.79-acre tract being
24 more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows with
25 bearings based on the Texas Coordinate System of 1983, Central
26 Zone:

4 THENCE North 12° 11' 45" East, at 471.32 feet pass a 5/8-inch
5 iron rod found for the northeast corner of said called 9.21-acre
6 tract and the southeast corner of the said called 2.872-acre tract,
7 a total distance of 644.37 feet to the POINT OF BEGINNING of the
8 herein described tract and containing 480.79 acres of land.

9 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
10 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
11 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
12 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
13 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
14 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
15 Government Code.

16 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
17 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
18 Environmental Quality.

19 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
20 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
21 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
22 representatives within the required time.

23 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
24 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
25 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
26 and accomplished.

27 SECTION 4. (a) Section 9094.0306, Special District Local

1 Laws Code, as added by Section 1 of this Act, takes effect only if
2 this Act receives a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to
3 each house.

4 (b) If this Act does not receive a two-thirds vote of all the
5 members elected to each house, Subchapter C, Chapter 9094, Special
6 District Local Laws Code, as added by Section 1 of this Act, is
7 amended by adding Section 9094.0306 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 9094.0306. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may
9 not exercise the power of eminent domain.

10 (c) This section is not intended to be an expression of a
11 legislative interpretation of the requirements of Section 17(c),
12 Article I, Texas Constitution.

13 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
17 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
