SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The National Life Monument celebrates the miracle of 3 life and the women at the center of that miracle; and

WHEREAS, Sculpted by artist Timothy Schmalz, the bronze sculpture depicts a mother with an unborn child cradled in a world-shaped womb; and

7 WHEREAS, The eight-foot statue can be seen at the Church of 8 San Marcello al Corso in Rome and at the Theological College in 9 Washington, D.C.; and

WHEREAS, Under Chapter 443, Government Code, and rules of the State Preservation Board, a portion of the north Capitol grounds is available for new monuments, subject to legislative approval, specified procedural requirements, the provision of funding from private donors, conformity to certain size and design limitations and parameters, and completion on a timely basis; and

16 WHEREAS, A replica of the monument on the Capitol grounds 17 would provide a communal place for Texans to celebrate the beauty of 18 human life; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas 20 hereby authorize the State Preservation Board, subject to state law 21 and rules of the board, to approve the construction of a Texas Life 22 Monument at the State Capitol Complex, at a site outside of the 23 historic Capitol grounds; and, be it further

24 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward an
