## 1 SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Situated on the Texas coast, Matagorda County 3 provides a diverse set of habitats that welcome hundreds of bird

4 species each year; and

5 WHEREAS, The county's shoreline and marshes attract birds

such as ospreys, pelicans, and egrets, while inland terrains are

7 home to hawks, hummingbirds, blackbirds, and more; along the area's

8 bays and rivers, loons, cormorants, and mergansers can be found,

9 and the county is also on the pathway for numerous migratory

10 species, including flycatchers, vireos, and orioles; and

11 WHEREAS, Since 1993, the county has participated in the

12 Audubon Christmas Bird Count, and it has consistently earned a top

13 ranking for its rich diversity of species; during the 2023-2024

14 count, the county had 225 types of birds in its tally, taking first

15 place for locations north of the U.S.-Mexico border; in addition,

16 it had the only examples of such rare birds as the surf scoter and

17 the blue grosbeak; and

18 WHEREAS, Matagorda County features many conservation areas

19 that help protect bird habitats; these include the Big Boggy

20 National Wildlife Refuge, the Mad Island Wildlife Management Area,

21 The Nature Conservancy's Clive Runnells Family Mad Island Marsh

22 Preserve, the Matagorda Peninsula Coastal Management Area, and the

23 Dog Island Preserve, which together encompass more than 26,000

24 acres; in addition, residents and visitors can enjoy the region's

- 1 biodiversity at the Matagorda County Birding Nature Center and the
- 2 Matagorda Bay Nature Park, and Palacios is the site of the annual
- 3 Matagorda Bay Birdfest, where attendees can enjoy bird tours, a
- 4 parade, a youth art contest, and other activities; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Matagorda County has demonstrated a notable
- 6 commitment to preserving its abundant natural resources, ensuring
- 7 that it will continue to host myriad bird species, and the county's
- 8 status as a premier location to appreciate avian wildlife is indeed
- 9 deserving of recognition; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the 89th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 11 hereby designate Matagorda County as the official Birding Capital
- 12 of Texas; and, be it further
- RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section
- 14 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in effect
- 15 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally
- 16 passed by the legislature.
