A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment providing for the
- 2 establishment of the Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of
- 3 Texas, establishing the Dementia Prevention and Research Fund to
- 4 provide money for research on and prevention and treatment of
- 5 dementia and related disorders in this state, and transferring to
- 6 that fund \$3 billion from state general revenue.
- 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 8 SECTION 1. Article III, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 9 adding Section 68 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 68. (a) The legislature shall establish the Dementia
- 11 Prevention and Research Institute of Texas to:
- 12 (1) award grants to institutions of learning, advanced
- 13 medical research facilities, public or private persons, and
- 14 collaboratives in this state to provide money for:
- 15 (A) research into the causes of, means of
- 16 prevention of, and treatment and rehabilitation for dementia and
- 17 related disorders;
- 18 (B) research, including translational research,
- 19 to develop therapies, protocols, medical pharmaceuticals, or
- 20 procedures for the substantial mitigation of the symptoms of
- 21 dementia and related disorders;
- (C) facilities, equipment, and other costs
- 23 related to research on dementia and related disorders; and
- 24 (D) prevention programs and strategies to

- 1 mitigate the detrimental health impacts of dementia and related
- 2 disorders;
- 3 (2) support institutions of learning and advanced
- 4 medical research facilities and collaboratives in this state in all
- 5 stages of:
- 6 (A) discovering the causes of dementia and
- 7 <u>related disorders;</u>
- 8 (B) developing therapies, protocols, medical
- 9 pharmaceuticals, or procedures for the substantial mitigation of
- 10 the symptoms of dementia and related disorders from laboratory
- 11 research to clinical trials; and
- 12 (C) developing programs to address access to
- 13 advanced treatment for dementia and related disorders; and
- 14 (3) establish the appropriate standards and oversight
- 15 bodies to ensure the proper use of funding authorized under this
- 16 <u>section</u>, including facilities development.
- 17 (b) The members of the governing body and any other
- 18 decision-making body of the Dementia Prevention and Research
- 19 Institute of Texas may serve six-year terms.
- 20 <u>(c) The Demen</u>tia Prevention and Research Fund is
- 21 established as a special fund in the state treasury outside the
- 22 general revenue fund to be administered by the Dementia Prevention
- 23 and Research Institute of Texas.
- 24 (c-1) On January 1, 2026, the comptroller shall transfer \$3
- 25 billion from this state's general revenue fund to the Dementia
- 26 Prevention and Research Fund. The transfer made under this
- 27 subsection is not an appropriation of state tax revenues for the

- 1 purposes of Section 22, Article VIII, of this constitution. This
- 2 subsection expires January 1, 2029.
- 3 (d) The Dementia Prevention and Research Fund consists of:
- (1) money transferred to the fund under this section; 4
- 5 (2) money the legislature appropriates, credits, or
- transfers to the fund; 6
- 7 (3) gifts and grants, including grants from the
- 8 federal government, and other donations received for the fund;
- 9 (4) patent, royalty, and license fees and other income
- 10 received under a contract executed by the Dementia Prevention and
- Research Institute of Texas; and 11
- 12 (5) investment earnings and interest earned on amounts
- 13 credited to the fund.
- (e) Notwithstanding any other provision of this 14
- 15 constitution, the Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of
- Texas, as established by general law, may use money in the Dementia 16
- 17 Prevention and Research Fund only for the purpose of funding:
- (1) grants for research on dementia and related 18
- 19 disorders, research facilities, and research opportunities in this
- 20 state:
- 21 (A) for the prevention, treatment, and
- 22 rehabilitation of dementia and related disorders and the mitigation
- of the incidence of and detrimental health impacts from dementia 23
- 24 and related disorders; and
- 25 (B) to develop therapies, protocols, medical
- 26 pharmaceuticals, or procedures for the substantial mitigation of
- the symptoms of dementia and related disorders; 27

- 1 (2) the purchase, construction, or renovation,
- 2 subject to the institute's approval, of facilities by or on behalf
- 3 of a state agency or grant recipient; and
- 4 (3) the institute's operation.
- 5 (f) The Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of Texas
- 6 may not award more than \$300 million in grants authorized under this
- 7 <u>section in a state fiscal year.</u>
- 8 (g) Before the Dementia Prevention and Research Institute
- 9 of Texas may award a grant authorized under this section, the grant
- 10 recipient must have available an unexpended amount of money equal
- 11 to one-half of the grant amount dedicated to the research specified
- 12 in the grant proposal.
- (h) The reasonable expenses of managing the assets of the
- 14 Dementia Prevention and Research Fund shall be paid from the fund.
- 15 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 16 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 17 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 18 proposition: "The constitutional amendment providing for the
- 19 establishment of the Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of
- 20 Texas, establishing the Dementia Prevention and Research Fund to
- 21 provide money for research on and prevention and treatment of
- 22 dementia and related disorders in this state, and transferring to
- 23 that fund \$3 billion from state general revenue."
