2	proposing a constitutional amendment authorizing the denial of bail
3	under limited circumstances to a person accused of certain violent
4	or sexual offenses or of continuous trafficking of persons.
5	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Article I, Texas Constitution, is amended by
7	adding Section 11d to read as follows:
8	Sec. 11d. (a) A person accused of committing a sexual
9	offense punishable as a felony of the first degree, of committing a
10	violent offense, or of committing continuous trafficking of persons
11	may be denied bail pending trial if a judge or magistrate determines
12	by clear and convincing evidence after a hearing that requiring
13	bail and conditions of release is insufficient to reasonably
14	ensure:
15	(1) the person's appearance in court as required; or
16	(2) the safety of the community, law enforcement, or
17	the victim of the alleged offense.
18	(b) A judge or magistrate who denies a person bail in
19	accordance with this section shall prepare a written order that
20	includes findings of fact and a statement explaining the judge's or
21	magistrate's reason for the denial.
22	(c) This section may not be construed to:
23	(1) limit any right a person has under other law to
24	contest a denial of bail or to contest the amount of bail set by a

- 1 judge or magistrate; or
- 2 (2) require any testimonial evidence before a judge or
- 3 magistrate makes a bail decision with respect to a person to whom
- 4 this section applies.
- 5 (d) For purposes of determining whether clear and
- 6 convincing evidence exists to deny a person bail as described by
- 7 this section, a judge or magistrate shall consider the factors
- 8 required to be considered by a judge or magistrate in setting bail
- 9 under general law, including statutory law governing criminal
- 10 procedure.
- 11 (e) In this section, "violent offense" and "sexual offense"
- 12 have the meanings assigned by Section 11a of this article.
- 13 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 14 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 4, 2025.
- 15 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 16 proposition: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the denial
- 17 of bail under limited circumstances to a person accused of certain
- 18 violent or sexual offenses or of continuous trafficking of
- 19 persons."
