RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Many notable citizens of Lubbock are visiting the
- 2 Texas Capitol on February 19, 2025, to pay tribute to their city's
- 3 rich heritage and to celebrate Lubbock Day; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Located within the Llano Estacado, Lubbock was
- 5 established in an area that was known for its tough conditions; as a
- 6 result, it was settled long after many other parts of the North
- 7 American continent, and the citizens who reside there today reflect
- 8 the same welcoming and resilient pioneer spirit as the early
- 9 founders; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The City of Lubbock was incorporated on March 16,
- 11 1909; railroads, farming, and ranching stimulated the city's growth
- 12 as a trade center, and when legislation creating Texas
- 13 Technological College was passed in 1923, the site selection
- 14 committee, impressed by the enthusiasm and hospitality of its
- 15 citizens, chose Lubbock for its location; and
- WHEREAS, Today, with a metropolitan area of more than 400,000
- 17 people, Lubbock is home to the Texas Tech University System and its
- 18 flagship institutions, Texas Tech University and the Texas Tech
- 19 Health Sciences Center, both world-renowned organizations; and
- WHEREAS, The Texas Tech Health Sciences Center attracts
- 21 nearly 5,500 students from around the world and is a top rural
- 22 hospital; and
- WHEREAS, Lubbock is consistently recognized by national
- 24 organizations for its business-friendly atmosphere, including

- 1 being named the number one city for women professionals; it is
- 2 ranked in the top 20 cities for young entrepreneurs starting a
- 3 business and was named seventh in the Forbes list of top
- 4 "Opportunity Cities," based on its low cost of living, its cultural
- 5 resources, and the strength of its business community; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Lubbock has a diverse economy that draws its
- 7 strength from agribusiness, manufacturing, and oil and gas, as well
- 8 as from educational and health care services, entertainment, and
- 9 the largest medical infrastructure in Texas west of I-35; the
- 10 city's meticulously planned infrastructure has resulted in a
- 11 low-traffic community with more neighborhood parks per capita than
- 12 any other city in Texas; and
- WHEREAS, With the growth of the cotton industry on the High
- 14 Plains, Lubbock has become one of the world's primary centers for
- 15 the processing of cottonseed and hybrid-grain sorghum seed;
- 16 moreover, the region just north of Lubbock has the highest density
- 17 of cattle in the entire country; Lubbock is now the home of several
- 18 major award-winning wineries and vineyards that produce more than
- 19 80 percent of the state's wine grapes; and
- WHEREAS, Lubbock offers a wealth of cultural and recreational
- 21 opportunities, including the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra, Ballet
- 22 Lubbock, the Silent Wings Museum, the Museum and Planetarium of
- 23 Texas Tech University, the new Buddy Holly Hall, a state-of-the-art
- 24 performing arts center, and many more; those wanting a glimpse of
- 25 frontier history can find it in the restored structures at the
- 26 National Ranching Heritage Center, a 15-acre site tracing the
- 27 evolution of ranch operations, architecture, and the history and

- 1 traditions of the cattle industry; the region's history is also
- 2 celebrated at the ever-expanding FiberMax Center for Discovery and
- 3 the picturesque American Windmill Museum; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The talented musicians who have come from the
- 5 Lubbock area include Buddy Holly and the Crickets, Roy Orbison, the
- 6 Maines family, Virgil Johnson and the Velvets, Waylon Jennings, Mac
- 7 Davis, Tanya Tucker, Joe Ely, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, Butch Hancock,
- 8 The Flatlanders, Jon Baumann, The Chicks, Flatland Cavalry, and
- 9 Josh Abbott, as well as Texas Tech alumni John Denver, Pat Green,
- 10 and William Clark Green; their rich and diverse contributions have
- 11 earned Lubbock recognition as the Music Crossroads of Texas; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Lubbock's thriving commerce is represented by the
- 13 largest business federation on the Texas South Plains, the Lubbock
- 14 Chamber of Commerce, which expands and guards the prosperity of the
- 15 Lubbock area; and
- WHEREAS, Early major achievements propelled by the chamber of
- 17 commerce during more than a century of service include recruiting
- 18 farmers from out of state to produce crops on the fertile soils of
- 19 the Llano Estacado, working to bring the railroad to Lubbock,
- 20 establishing the South Plains Fair, and drafting and delivering to
- 21 the Texas Capitol the application that would result in establishing
- 22 Texas Technological College, which today is the heart of the
- 23 Texas Tech University System; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The Lubbock Chamber of Commerce was instrumental in
- 25 establishing Lubbock Preston Smith International Airport, Reese
- 26 Air Force Base, and outstanding transportation infrastructure, and
- 27 it was the first chamber of commerce in Texas to introduce an

- 1 Association Health Plan for 34 West Texas counties, which became a
- 2 model nationwide; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Among the delegation visiting the Capitol today are
- 4 members of the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce's 47th Leadership
- 5 Lubbock Class, who represent the business and community leaders of
- 6 Lubbock; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The citizens of Lubbock have truly kept faith with
- 8 the founders of their West Texas community; renowned for their
- 9 faith, hospitality, and warmth as well as their hardiness and
- 10 determination, they have helped to build a vital urban center that
- 11 serves not only a large part of West Texas but also the surrounding
- 12 region; now, therefore, be it
- 13 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 89th Texas Legislature
- 14 hereby recognize February 19, 2025, as Lubbock Day at the State
- 15 Capitol and extend to the members of the visiting delegation and all
- 16 their fellow citizens sincere appreciation for the bright dusty
- 17 aura they add to the Lone Star State.
