## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Residents of Houston lost a political icon and
- 2 fierce champion of social justice with the passing of U.S.
- 3 Representative Sheila Jackson Lee on July 19, 2024, at the age of
- 4 74; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The daughter of Ezra Jackson and Ivalita Bennett
- 6 Jackson, the former Sheila Jackson was born in New York City on
- 7 January 12, 1950, and grew up in the borough of Queens; she earned a
- 8 bachelor's degree in political science as a member of Yale
- 9 University's first coed class and went on to complete her law degree
- 10 at the University of Virginia; following her marriage to Elwyn Lee,
- 11 a Houston native, she became the proud mother of two children, Jason
- 12 and Erica; and
- WHEREAS, In 1978, Congresswoman Jackson Lee moved to the
- 14 Bayou City with her husband and began working for the Fulbright &
- 15 Jaworski law firm; appointed as a municipal judge in 1987, she later
- 16 became a highly effective member of the city council; she won her
- 17 first congressional race in 1994 and was reelected 14 times, never
- 18 with less than 70 percent of the vote; known for her formidable work
- 19 ethic, she filed scores of bills addressing the needs of the most
- 20 vulnerable, and she did not hesitate to work across the aisle to
- 21 pass them; after the Violence Against Women Act expired in 2019, she
- 22 fought for its reenactment and authored the legislation that
- 23 achieved that goal; she was also the author and lead sponsor of the
- 24 Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, which established the

1 first new federal holiday in nearly four decades; her many other major initiatives included the Sentencing Reform Act, Paycheck 2 3 Fairness Act, and George Floyd Law Enforcement Trust and Integrity Act; known for her passionate speeches on the House floor, she 4 advocated for gay rights long before mainstream acceptance of the 5 movement and continued to serve as a powerful voice for progressive 6 causes, including Black Lives Matter and gun control; she took her 7 8 message to innumerable media outlets as well; most recently, she lent her support to a federal version of the CROWN Act to prevent 9 10 discrimination based on hairstyles favored by people of color; and WHEREAS, Congresswoman Jackson Lee held numerous leadership 11 12 roles, including chair of the Judiciary Subcommittee for Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security and senior member of 13 14 Judiciary, Homeland Security, and Budget Committees; she was the 15 House Democrats' chief deputy whip, chair of the Congressional Black Caucus Energy Braintrust, co-chair of the Justice Reform Task 16 17 Force, and a founder and chair of the Congressional Pakistan Caucus and the Congressional Children's Caucus; Congressional Quarterly 18 19 ranked her among the 50 most effective members of Congress; and WHEREAS, Devoted to her constituents, Congresswoman Jackson 20 Lee was instrumental in directing billions of federal dollars to 21 under-resourced communities; she helped her city recover from 22 numerous natural disasters and other crises, even personally 23 24 directing traffic to a COVID-19 testing site at the height of the pandemic and unloading food and supplies for residents during the 25 26 2021 freeze; over the years, she appeared at countless local meetings and events, and she demonstrated deep compassion to those 27

- 1 suffering loss, attending funerals, extending words of comfort, and
- 2 connecting the bereaved with support services; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Sheila Jackson Lee was a fearless warrior in behalf
- 4 of freedom, democracy, and positive change, and although she will
- 5 be greatly missed, her exceptional contributions will continue to
- 6 resonate in the years to come; now, therefore, be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 89th Texas Legislature
- 8 hereby pay tribute to the life of Sheila Jackson Lee and extend
- 9 sincere condolences to the members of her family: to her husband,
- 10 Elwyn Lee; to her children, Jason and Erica Lee; to her
- 11 grandchildren, Ellison Bennett Carter and Roy Lee Carter III; and
- 12 to her other relatives, her many friends, and all who mourn her
- 13 passing; and, be it further
