WHEREAS, The son of Felipe and Victoriana Alfaro, Pedro 4 5 "Pete" Alfaro was born on August 10, 1940; after graduating from The University of Texas at Austin, he was hired as an electrical 6 engineer by ExxonMobil, where he was employed for more than three 7 decades; he shared a fulfilling 61-year marriage with his wife, 8 Guadalupe, and they were blessed with four children, Debi, who 9 preceded him in death, Priscilla, Sandra, and Paul; offering 10 11 unconditional support, he attended their activities whenever possible as they grew up and encouraged their friends as well; and 12

13 WHEREAS, Mr. Alfaro was elected as Baytown's first Hispanic 14 mayor in 1989, and over the next 11 years, he worked tirelessly for the betterment of his community; his vision, determination, and 15 16 positive relationships with state officials were instrumental in the completion of the Fred Hartman Bridge over the Houston Ship 17 18 Channel, and he advocated powerfully for improving other infrastructure; he was a mentor to innumerable people while in 19 office and served in many other leadership roles, including member 20 21 of the board of San Jacinto Hospital, chair of the board of regents of Lee College, and president of the Rotary Club of Baytown; in 22 23 addition, he provided his expertise to Bay Area Homeless Services; during 27 years on the board of Houston Methodist Baytown, he 24

1 chaired the Patient and Family Advisory Council; the hospital named 2 its Lupe and Pete Alfaro Clinical Education and Training Facility 3 in honor of him and his wife, and among other accolades, he was 4 named 2004 Baytown Sun Citizen of the Year; and

5 WHEREAS, Pete Alfaro made a lasting, positive difference in 6 his community, and those he left behind will forever treasure their 7 memories of his warmth, kindness, and wonderful sense of humor; 8 now, therefore, be it
