WHEREAS, All who shared in the life of Gladys Faye Avitts Stone of Longview were deeply saddened by her death on July 23, 2024, at the age of 85; and

WHEREAS, A native of Hazard, Kentucky, the former Gladys Avitts was born to Lester and Abby Brown Avitts on July 16, 1939, and grew up sharing in the companionship of 11 siblings; she and her family moved to Texas when she was 12 years old, and after graduating from Friendswood High School in 1958, she attended Friends Bible College in Kansas, where she excelled at tennis; and
