SENATE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Senate of the State of Texas is pleased to recognize the Montgomery Independent School District on the occasion of its 100th anniversary; and

WHEREAS, In 1837, Dr. E. J. Arnold and C. E. Clepper donated land to build the first public school in the burgeoning town of Montgomery; citizens established the Montgomery School Association in 1846, and the Texas Legislature in Senate Bill 441 formally established the Montgomery Independent School District on March 16, 1925; and

WHEREAS, Despite facing significant challenges in its first year of operation, the district gained widespread community support and began to flourish through its affiliation with the Texas Department of Education; the completion of Lake Conroe in 1973 brought a wave of development to the region and allowed the district to greatly expand its facilities and educational opportunities for the community; and

WHEREAS, The Montgomery Independent School District has grown from a single-room schoolhouse to a thriving educational system with 11 campuses that serve nearly 10,000 students, and it has preserved its fundamental small-town values while upholding a commitment to academic excellence; and
