RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The life of an esteemed lawmaker and public servant 2 drew to a close with the passing of the Honorable Sylvester Turner

3 on March 5, 2025, at the age of 70; and

WHEREAS, Congressman Turner's monumental career encompassed
service as a state legislator, as the mayor of Houston, and as a

6 member of the United States House of Representatives, and the

7 ideals that guided all of his work were forged in the Bayou City's

8 Acres Homes neighborhood, where he was raised; born on

9 September 27, 1954, he shared a two-bedroom house with his parents

10 and eight siblings in his early years; while watching the

11 Kennedy-Nixon debates with his family as a small boy, he resolved to

12 become a lawyer and public servant, beginning his lifelong

13 commitment to helping others; his father, a commercial painter,

14 died when he was just 13, and his mother continued to support the

15 family as a housekeeper at the Rice Hotel; although neither of his

16 parents received a diploma, he became student body president and

17 valedictorian at Klein High School, and he went on to graduate from

18 the University of Houston and Harvard Law School; and

19 WHEREAS, Congressman Turner began his career as a trial

20 lawyer with the Fulbright & Jaworski firm and later cofounded

21 Barnes & Turner, a practice focused on commercial law and personal

22 injury litigation; in addition, he taught at the Texas Southern

23 University Thurgood Marshall School of Law, at the South Texas

24 College of Law, and in the University of Houston Law School

1 continuing legal education program; and

2 WHEREAS, First elected to the Texas House of Representatives 3 in 1988, Congressman Turner was returned to office 13 times and served three terms as speaker pro tempore; he helped shape fiscal 4 policy during more than two decades on the House Appropriations 5 Committee and multiple terms as chair of its Subcommittee on 6 Criminal Justice; moreover, he distinguished himself in his duties 7 8 as a member of the Legislative Budget Board and as chair of the Texas Legislative Black Caucus and the Greater Houston Area 9 Legislative Delegation; known for his eloquence and his ability to 10 work across the aisle, he secured passage of such important 11 legislation as a 2007 children's health insurance measure; his 12 passion for health care, education, human services, consumer 13 14 rights, and juvenile justice earned him recognition as "the 15 conscience of the House"; and

16 WHEREAS, Congressman Turner was elected to the first of two 17 terms as Houston mayor in 2015; he guided the city through a period of unprecedented challenges, among them Hurricane Harvey and six 18 other federally declared disasters, as well as the COVID-19 19 pandemic; early in his tenure, he strengthened finances by crafting 20 21 a solution for the mounting pension debt crisis; he also promoted sustainability, bolstering the city's status as the energy capital 22 of the world; addressing violent crime and mental health, he 23 24 launched the One Safe Houston initiative, and other important programs included Hire Houston Youth, One Clean Houston, and 25 Complete Communities, which fostered economic advancement through 26 revitalization of underserved areas; in addition to his other 27

- 1 responsibilities, he provided national leadership in urban policy
- 2 as chair of the Global Resilient Cities Network, Climate Mayors,
- 3 and the African American Mayors Association, and he was a trustee of
- 4 the U.S. Conference of Mayors; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In 2024, citizens elected him to Congress to 6 represent the historically significant 18th Congressional 7 District, and he served as a member of the Homeland Security and the 8 Science, Space, and Technology Committees; during his time in
- 9 office, he maintained the incomparable work ethic and whirlwind
- 10 pace that defined his entire career, devoting himself to the
- 11 lawmaking process, staying in close touch with constituents, and
- 12 participating in numerous neighborhood and community-wide events
- 13 in Houston; he also set aside time to attend the Church Without
- 14 Walls, where he worshipped for well over three decades, and he
- 15 rarely missed a Sunday service, even while undergoing cancer
- 16 treatment; he was a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity,
- 17 Incorporated, and remained a proud Acres Homes resident; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Dedicated to bridging divisions and creating
- 19 vibrant communities for all, Sylvester Turner demonstrated
- 20 visionary leadership that greatly benefited the city of Houston and
- 21 the wider State of Texas, and his legacy will continue to inspire
- 22 all those who seek to follow in his footsteps; now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 89th Texas Legislature
- 24 hereby honor the memory of Congressman Sylvester Turner and extend
- 25 sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his daughter,
- 26 Ashley Turner Captain, and her husband, Jimmie; to his grandson,
- 27 Jameson Captain; and to his other relatives and many friends; and,
