14 WHEREAS, Kevin Camarata has advanced Texas masonry over the course of four decades; as CEO of Camarata Masonry Systems, he built 15 one of the nation's largest firms, which has redrawn Houston's 16 skyline with such iconic projects as Enron Field and Rice 17 University; he served as president of the board of TMC and authored 18 key bylaws and fostered supplier engagement; recognizing the 19 20 importance of workforce development, he championed training programs through Construction Career Collaborative; he also guided 21 industry best practices through involvement with MCAA and the 22 23 Associated Masonry Contractors of Houston; and
