R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Jill Diane Warrington Glover, a prominent and
2 dedicated member of the Republican Party of Texas, passed away on
3 January 14, 2024, at the age of 63; and

4 WHEREAS, The former Jill Warrington was born in Palestine on
5 October 10, 1960, to Nancy and Forrest Warrington, and she grew up
6 with the companionship of two brothers, David and Dennis; during
7 her youth, she explored a number of interests, including music,
8 ballet, and poetry, and she graduated from Palestine High School,
9 where she served as a member of the drill team; she went on to attend
10 Stephen F. Austin State University, ultimately earning a master's
11 degree in psychology, and worked as a local radio personality while
12 completing her studies; and

13 WHEREAS, Mrs. Glover was employed at Texas State Mental
14 Health Services in Longview before establishing her own private
15 practice in Dallas, where she specialized in helping women
16 suffering from eating disorders and abuse trauma; she also served
17 as a psychology professor at Dallas County Community College and as
18 a part-time teacher at Coram Deo Academy; and

19 WHEREAS, A stalwart champion of conservative values,
20 Mrs. Glover was selected to represent Senate District 12 on the
21 State Republican Executive Committee in 2018; she also chaired the
22 Legislative Priorities Committee, and over the course of her
23 tenure, she provided essential support for the party's priority
24 bills, including the Texas Heartbeat Act and the permitless carry

1 bill from the 87th Regular Session; her determined efforts during
2 the 88th Legislature helped 35 priority bills, in whole or in part,
3 to become law, and she worked closely with State Senator Donna
4 Campbell to secure the passage of Senate Bill 14, which prohibited
5 the use of state funds for child gender modification; and

6 WHEREAS, In addition to her frequent visits to the State
7 Capitol to discuss important issues with legislators, Mrs. Glover
8 was instrumental in organizing town halls and other initiatives
9 across Texas; she also utilized her radio skills to record updates
10 for grassroots political organizations, and she published a weekly
11 newsletter to inform the public about current events; and

12 WHEREAS, Deeply devoted to her family, Mrs. Glover shared a
13 rewarding marriage with her husband, Curtis, and she took great
14 pride in her son, Nicholas; in all her endeavors, she drew strength
15 from her Christian faith; and

16 WHEREAS, The life of Jill Glover stands as an inspiring
17 example of civic engagement, and her work will be remembered and
18 admired for years to come; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 89th Texas Legislature
20 hereby pay tribute to the memory of Jill Diane Warrington Glover and
21 extend heartfelt sympathy to the members of her family: to her
22 husband, Curtis Glover; to her son, Nicholas Glover; to her
23 brothers, David and Dennis Warrington; and to her other relatives
24 and friends; and, be it further

25 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
26 prepared for her family and that when the Texas Senate adjourns this
27 day, it do so in memory of Jill Glover.
