Stewart, began guiding the church in March of 1939; during his four decades of service, the church constructed a children's chapel, and Gothic-style stained glass windows were installed in the sanctuary and are still displayed and treasured today; and

WHEREAS, Trinity Episcopal Church has undertaken many worthy projects that have benefited the community, including creating the Pharr Emergency Food Pantry in 1978, which inspired the establishment of the Food Bank of the Rio Grande Valley; and

WHEREAS, Over the past century, Trinity Episcopal Church has been a spiritual refuge for innumerable Christians, and it upholds its enduring mission of service through the leadership of Rev. Canon Sharon Alexander, the church's first woman rector; it is truly fitting that the church receive special recognition on reaching this remarkable milestone in its history; now,
