WHEREAS, The American Warrior Association offers a wide array of support services with the goal to honor and improve the well-being of our nation's heroes, which also aligns with R3's mission to heal, support, and foster resilience in those affected by moral injury; and

WHEREAS, The R3 program provides access to critical tools and resources through training, culturally competent counseling, and access to non-clinical preventative care designed to reduce stigma and strengthen service members' ability to de-escalate situations and process trauma; this vital initiative allows the American Warrior Association to promote a healthier first responder and veteran workforce in our state, which leads to improved wellness,
