RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Family and friends were deeply saddened by the 2 passing of Thomas Morrell Terry Jr. of Cisco on March 30, 2025, at 3 the age of 87; and

WHEREAS, Born in Cisco on December 8, 1937, Tommy Terry was 4 5 the son of Thomas Terry Sr. and Zora Eppler Terry, and he grew up with the companionship of three siblings, Bill, Dorothy, and Wanda; 6 7 he shared a rewarding union with his wife, Patsy, that spanned nearly four and a half decades until her passing in 1999; he was the 8 proud father of four children, Jeffrey, Greg, Sydney, and Kim; with 9 the passing years, his treasured family grew to include five 10 grandchildren, Craig, Brittany, Steven, John, and Masyn, and 11 12 several great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Mr. and Mrs. Terry lived in Mason and Anson; while a 13 14 student at The University of Texas at Austin, he worked as a nighttime security guard at the State Capitol and as a nursing home 15 16 administrator; in 1966, he got a job with the Humble Oil Company, which later became Exxon, and they moved to Baytown; for 30 years, 17 he worked at the Baytown Refinery and was most proud of his 18 involvement with the startup of the Fuels North area of the facility 19 20 in the late '70s; he served as a mentor to countless coworkers over the years, and in 1996, he retired from his position as a chief 21 22 operator at Exxon; and

23 WHEREAS, A few years after his wife died, Mr. Terry bought a 24 lake house in Cisco, and most mornings, he could be found at the

local Dairy Queen socializing with friends; in his later years, he ran errands for the homebound, visited nursing home residents, and took friends to doctor appointments; his desire to help others was also demonstrated in the 1960s and '70s through his involvement in the Optimist Pee Wee football program, through which he purchased equipment for underprivileged children; and

7 WHEREAS, Although he will be deeply missed, Tommy Terry has 8 left his family and friends with many cherished memories, and he 9 will forever hold a special place in their hearts; now, therefore, 10 be it
