WHEREAS, The son of Eugene and Mary Price, Hoover Price was born in Marietta on July 11, 1929; he completed his early education in Floyd County, and he moved to Texarkana following high school to take a job as a forklift driver with the Red River Army Depot; after leaving to work for W. S. Dickey Clay Manufacturing Company for a brief period, he returned to RRAD in 1967 and eventually retired from the company in 1990; and
