12 WHEREAS, Mr. Hanlon embarked on a career in business with the Columbia Broadcast System, and he held a position with WBBM Radio in 13 14 Chicago for several years; in 1967, he assumed a new role as controller of the New York Yankees Baseball Club, and he went on to 15 16 serve as vice president of Viacom Inc. and as president of Suffolk Cablevision before accepting an offer from Buford Cable Television 17 in Tyler to operate and expand the company's cable television 18 nationwide operations; in 1981, he created his own cable television 19 company, MCT Cablevision Inc., and after it was sold to Northland 20 21 Cable Television, he served as regional vice president of its Texas locations; he later opened a Berkshire Hathaway real estate 22 23 franchise in Tyler as a broker before his retirement; and
