SR 702 **Hughes**
Suspending limitations on conference committee jurisdiction, H.B. No. 3642.

Suspending limitations on conference committee jurisdiction, S.B. No. 650.

Suspending limitations on conference committee jurisdiction on S.B. No. 2972.

Designating Bridge City as the official Corn Dog Capital of Texas for a 10-year period ending in 2035.

HCR 149 **Bumgarner/ Hefner/ Spiller/
Wilson/ Little** **SP: Hancock**
Directing the governor of the State of Texas to posthumously award the Texas Legislative Medal of Honor to U.S. Navy SEAL Nathan Gage Ingram of Roanoke.

HCR 155 **Martinez Fischer** **SP: Menéndez**
Designating San Antonio as Military City Texas for a 10-year period ending in 2035.

HCR 157 **Hunter** **SP: Kolkhorst/ et al.**
Designating Rockport as the official Redfish Capital of Texas for a 10-year period ending in 2035.

The Senate concurred in House amendments to the following:

SB 1637 (CS) (LC) **King** **SP: Hefner**
Relating to the prosecution of the offense of deadly conduct.

The Senate refused to concur in House amendments and requested the appointment of a Conference Committee on the following:

SB 293 (CS) Huffman/ et al. SP: Leach
Relating to the discipline of judges by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct, notice of certain reprimands, judicial compensation and related retirement benefits, and the reporting of certain judicial transparency information; authorizing an administrative penalty.

The Senate adopted conference committee reports on the following bills:

SB 268 (CS) (LC) Perry/ et al. SP: Howard
Relating to the procedure for certain complaints against health care practitioners.

SB 650 (CS) West/ et al. SP: Bowers/ Thompson/ et al.
Relating to requiring the use of electronically readable information to verify a purchaser's age in the retail sale of alcoholic beverages.

SB 1610 (CS) (LC) Perry/ Flores SP: Cook/ Harless
Relating to sexually violent predators, to the Texas Civil Commitment Office, and to the prosecution of the offense of harassment by sexually violent predators and other persons confined in certain facilities; amending certain sex offender registration requirements; increasing criminal penalties.

SB 1660 (CS) (LC) Huffman SP: Cook
Relating to the retention and preservation of toxicological evidence of certain intoxication offenses.

SB 2024 (CS) (LC) Perry/ et al. SP: Leach/ Lalani/ et al.
Relating to a prohibition on marketing, advertising, or selling certain e-cigarette products; creating a criminal offense.

SB 2217 (CS) (LC) Hughes/ et al. SP: Shaheen
Relating to certain election practices and procedures.

SB 2753 (CS) Hall/ et al. SP: Isaac
Relating to a study on the feasibility of integrating early voting by personal appearance and election day voting, including the manner in which election returns are processed and other related changes.

SB 2900 (CS) Kolkhorst SP: Bhojani/ Capriglione/ et al.
Relating to certain advisory entities and work groups under the jurisdiction of the comptroller of public accounts or on which the comptroller's office is represented and to the repeal or redesignation of certain of those entities.

SB 2972 (CS) Creighton/ et al. SP: Leach
Relating to expressive activities at public institutions of higher education.

HB 40 (CS) (LC) Landgraf/ Meyer/ Leach/ Schofield/ LaHood SP: Hughes
Relating to the business court.

HB 46 (CS) King/ Moody/ Oliverson/ Plesa/ Lalani/ et al. SP: Perry/ et al.
Relating to the medical use of low-THC cannabis under and the administration of the Texas Compassionate-Use Program; requiring registration.

HB 119 (CS) (LC) Gerdes/ Bonnen/ Capriglione/ Metcalf/ Troxclair/ et al. SP: Hughes/ et al.
Relating to the applicability of lobbyist registration requirements to persons engaged in certain foreign transactions or lobbying activities on behalf of a foreign adversary and to prohibitions on the receipt of compensation related to those lobbying activities; providing a civil penalty.

HB 145 (CS) King/ et al. SP: Schwertner
Relating to risk mitigation planning and associated liability for providers of electric service; providing an administrative penalty.
