**IN RE: HB1661** by Vasut (Relating to election supplies and the conduct of elections; creating criminal offenses; increasing criminal penalties.), **As Engrossed** 

#### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would create two Class A misdemeanor offenses applicable to the authority responsible for procuring election supplies for failure to provide a certain number of ballots and failure to supplement distributed ballots. The bill would increase the penalty for the offense of failure to distribute or deliver supplies from a Class C misdemeanor to a Class A misdemeanor, the penalty for the offense of obstructing distribution of supplies from a Class C misdemeanor to a Class A misdemeanor, and the penalty for the offense of unlawfully revealing information before polls close from a Class A misdemeanor to a state jail felony.

It is assumed that any fiscal impact and any impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources would not be significant.

#### **Local Government Impact**

It is assumed that any fiscal impact to units of local government associated with enforcement, prosecution, supervision, or confinement would not be significant.
