IN RE: HB5318 by Louderback (Relating to the authority of the attorney general to prosecute certain criminal offenses against public order.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would expand the Office of the Attorney General's ability to persecute certain criminal offenses.

It is assumed that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed using existing resources.
