IN RE: HB5616 by Howard (Relating to the Texas presidential library promotion program and funding for the program.), **As Passed 2nd House**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would establish the Texas Presidential Library Promotion Program for the Texas Historical Commission (THC) to promote and support the Lyndon Baines Johnson Library and Museum, George Bush Presidential Library and Museum, and the George W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum. The program would market and promote the libraries and collaborate with the libraries to develop a mobile exhibit to be displayed in communities, schools and public institutions.

The bill would allow THC to contract with a nonprofit entity to administer and operate the program.

The bill would establish an account that would consist of gifts, grants, donations and legislative appropriations to be used for the program.

It is assumed that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed using existing resources.

Note: This legislation would do one or more of the following: create or recreate a dedicated account in the General Revenue Fund, create or recreate a special or trust fund either in, with, or outside the Treasury, or create a dedicated revenue source. The fund, account, or revenue dedication included in this bill would be subject to funds consolidation review by the current Legislature.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
