**IN RE: SB1198** by Birdwell (Relating to the designation of spaceports as critical infrastructure facilities for purposes of criminal and civil liability.), **As Passed 2nd House**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
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The bill would expand the applicability of the offenses of damaging or destroying critical infrastructure facility, impairing or interrupting operation of critical infrastructure facility, intent to damage or destroy critical infrastructure facility, and intent to impair or interrupt operation of critical infrastructure facility to include any property or hazard area related to the operation of a launch complex authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration, or facility that is used for the launch, landing, recovery, or testing of spacecraft. It is assumed that any fiscal impact and any impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources would not be significant.

**Local Government Impact**

It is assumed that any fiscal impact to units of local government associated with enforcement, prosecution, supervision, or confinement would not be significant.
