**IN RE: SB1451** by Flores (Relating to increasing the criminal penalty for the offense of stealing or receiving a stolen check or similar sight order.), **As Introduced** 

### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would increase the penalty for the offense of stealing or receiving a stolen check or similar sight order from a Class A misdemeanor to a state jail felony. It is assumed that any fiscal impact and any impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources would not be significant.

#### **Local Government Impact**

It is assumed that any fiscal impact to units of local government associated with enforcement, prosecution, supervision, or confinement would not be significant.
