The chair called the meeting to order at 8:00 AM. The following business was transacted:

The chair laid out HB 2026 and recognized the Senate sponsor, Senator Hagenbuch, to explain the bill. No witnesses registered or testified on the bill. The chair moved that the public testimony be closed; without objection, it was so ordered. Senator Nichols moved that HB 2026 be left pending; without objection, it was so ordered.
