Good afternoon. My name is Dacia Cahanin-Salinas, and I am an Advanced Aesthetic Injector and the owner of a Med Spa in Texas. I didn't fall into this profession — I built it. I underwent extensive, specialized training in cosmetic injections, and I take great pride in the safety, results, and trust I provide to every client I treat.

I'm here today because Senate Bill 378 doesn't protect public safety — it limits it. This bill assumes that holding a medical license alone qualifies someone to inject. But anyone in this industry knows the truth: medical and nursing programs do not teach cosmetic injections. They teach anatomy, yes, but not how to safely and artistically inject, manage aesthetic complications, or understand facial balancing. Even licensed professionals — including physicians — must seek additional, non-traditional training to practice aesthetic injections safely.

The bill also ignores a key fact: there is no evidence of widespread harm or public danger from injectors working under physician delegation. The existing model already allows physicians to supervise and delegate responsibly. So instead of creating artificial barriers based on titles, let's create solutions based on skills.

I propose an alternative: Texas should create a standardized, state-accredited training program with a required practical exam. Anyone — licensed or not — would be required to complete this training, prove their knowledge, and demonstrate safe technique before being allowed to inject.

When it comes to protecting Texans, competency matters more than credentials. Let's raise the standards — not build walls.
