4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 31.0211(f), Education Code, is amended
6	to read as follows:
7	(f) Funds allotted under this section may not be used to
8	purchase instructional material that:
9	(1) contains obscene or harmful content or would
10	otherwise cause the school district to which the funds were
11	allotted to be unable to submit the certification required under
12	Section 31.1011(a)(1)(B) <u>; or</u>
13	(2) is on the list of rejected instructional materials
14	maintained by the State Board of Education under Section 31.022(a).
15	SECTION 2. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by
16	adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
17	(b-1) Not later than the 45th day before the date the State
18	Board of Education intends to add an instructional material to the
19	list of rejected instructional materials under Subsection (a), the
20	board shall add the material to a list of proposed rejected
21	instructional materials and issue a proclamation requesting the
22	revision of the applicable instructional material before the end of
23	the 45-day period.
24	SECTION 3. Subchapter B, Chapter 31, Education Code, is

amended by adding Section 31.024 to read as follows: Sec. 31.024. LIMITATION ON AND THE ADOPTION USE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL. A school district may not adopt or otherwise use instructional material included on the list of rejected instructional materials maintained by the State Board of Education under Section 31.022(a). SECTION 4. Section 31.073, Education Code, is amended by adding Subsection (b) and amending Subsection (c) to read as follows: (b) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may only adopt or otherwise use an open education resource instructional material that is not included on the list of rejected instructional materials maintained by the State Board of Education under Section 31.022(a). (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may adopt open education resource instructional material that complies with Subsection (b) at any time. SECTION 5. Section 31.106, Education Code, is amended to read as follows: Sec. 31.106. USE OF LOCAL FUNDS. In addition to any instructional material selected under this chapter, a school district or open-enrollment charter school may use local funds to purchase any instructional materials not included on the list of rejected instructional materials maintained by the State Board of Education under Section 31.022(a). SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year. 2

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1 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
