4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.0521 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.0521. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION OF EDUCATORS FROM
8	OUTSIDE THIS STATE. (a) The board shall:
9	(1) establish a temporary certificate for educators
10	certified by other states; and
11	(2) immediately issue a certificate described by
12	Subdivision (1) to a person who applies for a certificate issued
13	under Section 21.052.
14	(b) The board may rescind a temporary certificate issued to
15	a person under this section if the board determines as a result of a
16	review of the person's credentials that the person does not meet the
17	eligibility requirements under Subsection (c).
18	(c) To be eligible for a temporary certificate issued under
19	this section, a person must:
20	(1) hold a valid, unexpired, non-temporary
21	certificate or similar credential in another state that qualifies
22	the person to be employed as an educator in that state; and
23	(2) hold a bachelor's degree from an institution of
24	higher education that is, and at the time the person received the

- 2 (d) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a temporary
- 3 certificate issued under this section expires on the earlier of:
- 4 (1) the first anniversary of the date the certificate
- 5 was issued; or
- 6 (2) the date the person is issued a certificate under
- 7 <u>Section 21.052.</u>
- 8 (e) A temporary certificate issued under this section to an
- 9 educator who is the spouse of a person serving on active duty as a
- 10 member of the armed forces of the United States, as those terms are
- 11 defined by Section 55.001, Occupations Code, expires on the third
- 12 anniversary of the date the certificate was issued or a later date
- 13 specified by board rule.
- 14 (f) A temporary certificate issued under this section may
- 15 not be reissued or renewed.
- 16 SECTION 2. Sections 21.052(c), (d), (d-1), and (e),
- 17 Education Code, are repealed.
- 18 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 19 of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall adopt
- 20 rules necessary to implement Section 21.0521, Education Code, as
- 21 added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
