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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 102.008, Family Code, is amended by 6 adding Subsection (c-1) and amending Subsection (d) to read as 7 follows:

(c-1) The petitioner shall additionally submit to the court 8 a certified copy of the child's birth certificate if available to 9 the petitioner. If a certified copy of the child's birth 10 11 certificate is not available to the petitioner, the court at any time during the pendency of the suit may request another party to 12 13 whom a certified copy of the child's birth certificate is available to submit a copy to the court. A certified copy of the child's birth 1415 certificate submitted under this subsection must be submitted for filing under seal and filed separately from any other document. If 16 17 a certified copy of the child's birth certificate is not available to any party or if the copy does not name both of the child's 18 parents, the court may request from any party at any time during the 19 pendency of the suit alternative proof of the identity of the 20 21 child's parents. The court shall seal or otherwise keep 22 confidential any certificate or other proof submitted under this 23 subsection, as applicable.
