5 SECTION 1. Section 54.535, Education Code, is amended by

13 session of less than six weeks], for the sole purpose of financing,

constructing, operating, maintaining, and improving a student

15 union building for The University of Texas at El Paso, including

16 demolition of the existing student union building; provided,

17 however, that the fee may not be increased to an amount that exceeds

18 by at least 10 percent the amount of the fee levied during the

19 preceding academic year, [above \$15 per student for each regular

20 semester or each summer session of six weeks or more and \$7.50 per

21 student for each summer session of less than six weeks] unless the

22 increase is approved by a majority vote of [those] students

23 enrolled at the university participating in a general student

24 election held for that purpose. The fees herein authorized to be

- 2 authorized to be levied.
- 3 (a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), for a semester or
- 4 term before the 2026 fall semester, the amount of a fee levied under
- 5 this section may not exceed:
- 6 (1) \$70 per student for a semester or term of 10 weeks
- 7 or more; or
- 8 (2) \$35 per student for a semester or term not
- 9 <u>described by Subdivision (1).</u>
- 10 <u>(a-2)</u> Notwithstanding Subsection (a), for a semester or
- 11 term of the 2026-2027 academic year, the amount of a fee levied
- 12 under this section may not exceed:
- 13 (1) \$120 per student for a semester or term of 10 weeks
- 14 <u>or more;</u> or
- 15 (2) \$60 per student for a semester or term not
- 16 <u>described by Subdivision (1).</u>
- 17 (a-3) Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) and this subsection
- 18 expire September 1, 2027.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 54.535, Education Code, as amended by
