8	not void a damage waiver unless:
9	(1) an authorized driver causes the damage
10	intentionally or by wilful and wanton misconduct;
11	(2) the damage arises out of use of the vehicle:
12	(A) by a person:
13	(i) who is not an authorized driver;
14	(ii) while under the influence of an
15	intoxicant that impairs driving ability, including alcohol, an
16	illegal drug, or a controlled substance; or
17	(iii) while engaged in commission of a
18	crime other than a traffic infraction;
19	(B) to carry persons or property for hire;
20	(C) to push or tow anything;
21	(D) for driver's training;
22	(E) to engage in a speed contest; or
23	(F) outside the continental United States,
24	unless the rental agreement specifically authorizes the use; [or]
