BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 4151, Insurance Code, is 5 amended by adding Section 4151.1531 to read as follows:

6 <u>Sec. 4151.1531. SECURITY OF PATIENT DATA.</u> A pharmacy 7 <u>benefit manager may not store or process patient data for a resident</u> 8 <u>of this state in a location outside of the United States or its</u> 9 <u>territories.</u>

SECTION 2. Section 4151.1531, Insurance Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a contract entered into or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act.
