6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Parks and Wildlife
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 12.023 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 12.023. NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN STRUCTURES.
9	(a) This section applies only in a county with a population of less
10	than 500,000 that:
11	(1) borders the Gulf of Mexico and in which a national
12	wildlife refuge is wholly or partly located; or
13	(2) does not contain a municipality with a population
14	greater than 300,000 and is adjacent to a county described by
15	Subdivision (1).
16	(b) Not later than the 90th day before a person begins
17	construction of a structure taller than 500 feet, the person shall
18	submit to the department a request for the department to review the
19	<pre>project under Section 12.0011(b)(3).</pre>
20	(c) Not later than the 45th day after a request under
21	Subsection (b), the department shall recommend in writing measures
22	to minimize the impact of the structure on migratory birds.
23	(d) If the department does not provide recommendations to
24	the requestor under Subsection (c) within 45 days, the construction

- 1 of the project may proceed without further delay or modification.
- 2 (e) Not later than the 45th day after receiving the
- 3 recommendations under Subsection (c), the requestor shall provide a
- 4 written response to the department accepting the recommendations or
- 5 providing alternative minimization measures in place of department
- 6 recommendations not feasible based on considerations including
- 7 technology or engineering limitations and cost.
- 8 <u>(f)</u> Information submitted to the department under this
- 9 section is not subject to Chapter 552, Government Code, and may not
- 10 be disclosed to any person, including a state or federal agency,
- 11 without the written consent of the person submitting the
- 12 information.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 12.023, Parks and Wildlife Code, as
- 14 added by this Act, applies only to a person who begins construction
- 15 of a structure on or after the 180th day after the effective date of
- 16 this Act.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 12, Parks and Wildlife
- 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 12.023 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 12.023. NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN STRUCTURES.
- 9 (a) This section applies only in a county with a population of less
- 10 than 500,000 that:
- 11 (1) borders the Gulf of Mexico and in which a national
- 12 wildlife refuge is wholly or partly located; or
- 13 (2) does not contain a municipality with a population
- 14 greater than 300,000 and is adjacent to a county described by
- 15 Subdivision (1).
- 16 (b) Not later than the 90th day before the date a person
- 17 begins construction of a structure taller than 500 feet, the person
- 18 shall submit to the department a request for the department to
- 19 review the project under Section 12.0011(b)(3).
- (c) Not later than the 45th day after the date the
- 21 department receives a request under Subsection (b), the department
- 22 shall recommend in writing measures to minimize the impact of the
- 23 structure on migratory birds.
- 24 (d) If the department does not provide recommendations

- 1 under Subsection (c) to the person who requested review within the
- 2 period required by that subsection, the construction of the project
- 3 may proceed without further delay or modification.
- 4 (e) Not later than the 45th day after the date the person who
- 5 requested review receives the recommendations under Subsection
- 6 (c), the person shall provide a written response to the department
- 7 accepting the recommendations or providing alternative
- 8 <u>minimization measures in place of department recommendations.</u>
- 9 <u>(f) Not later than the 45th day after the date the</u>
- 10 department receives alternative minimization measures under
- 11 Subsection (e), the department may bring an action for injunctive
- 12 relief as provided by Subsection (g) if the department determines
- 13 that the proposed structure, if constructed utilizing the
- 14 alternative minimization measures, would materially damage
- 15 migratory birds in this state.
- 16 (g) The department may bring an action for injunctive relief
- 17 for a violation of this section or as provided by Subsection (f) to
- 18 limit or enjoin the construction of a structure in a district court
- 19 for the county in which the structure is being or is proposed to be
- 20 constructed. The court may grant appropriate injunctive relief in
- 21 an action under this subsection if the court determines that:
- (1) the person violated this section; or
- (2) the proposed structure, if constructed utilizing
- 24 the alternative minimization measures, would materially damage
- 25 migratory birds in this state.
- 26 (h) In making a determination under Subsection (f) or
- (g)(2), the department or the court, as applicable, may consider

- 1 the cumulative impact of all structures the person proposes to
- 2 construct for the project.
- 3 (i) The department is not required to post a bond in an
- 4 action for injunctive relief under this section.
- 5 (j) Information submitted to the department under this
- 6 section is not subject to Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 7 (k) This section does not apply to a facility that supports
- 8 space flight activities, as defined by Section 100A.001, Civil
- 9 Practice and Remedies Code.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 12.023, Parks and Wildlife Code, as
- 11 added by this Act, applies only to a person who begins construction
- 12 of a structure on or after the 90th day after the effective date of
- 13 this Act.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

the bill, in added Section 12.023, Parks and Wildlife Code (page 2 3 1, line 52, through page 2, line 14), by striking Subsections (f), 4 (g), (h), and (i), substituting the following appropriate lettered 5 subsection, and relettering subsequent subsections of that section 6 accordingly: 7 () If the department does not agree to the alternative minimization measures received under Subsection (e), the 8 department shall reach a final decision on the minimization 9 measures the structure must utilize not later than the 45th day 10 after the date the department received the alternative 11 minimization measures. If the department requires compliance with 12 13 minimization measures other than those agreed to by the person who requested review, the person is entitled to an administrative 14 15 hearing.
