17	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, a person who is entitled

19	is not considered a Texas resident under this subchapter for
20	purposes of a financial aid program offered by this state.
21	SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
22	beginning with tuition and other fees charged for the 2025 fall
23	semester. Tuition and other fees charged for an academic period
24	before that semester are covered by the law in effect immediately
